Chicago Sept. 5.—It was a tame market in wheat today, prices drifting within a narrow range to slight losses at the bell. Speculative diffidence was strikingly accentuated. Despite the appreciable improvement in export demand, firmness in the domestic cash situation, a higher close at Liverpool, prices sagged through the session in a quiet way.
