

Omaha Grain

Omaha, Sept. 10. Total receipts at Omaha were 222 cars, against 124 cars last year. Total shipments were 173 cars, against 117 cars last year.

There was a fair demand for wheat on the Omaha market with prices generally unchanged to 1/2 cent higher. Oats were quoted unchanged to 1/2 cent lower, and barley firm and unchanged.

Influenced by higher Liverpool wheat prices, the Chicago market was weak. Local traders were slow to bid, and a minor dip was seen registered.

Receipts were heavy for the opening day of the week and as usual at this time of the year. Receipts were 1,800 head.

Wheat closed higher to 1/2 cent lower, and rye ruled unchanged to 1/2 cent higher. Considerable of the selling that filtered into the pit was executed by houses with northwest connections.

Corn closed higher, while the deferred months eased in anticipation of the heaviest government report issued after the close. There was selling at times credited to cash interests.

Country offerings from the winter belt were light. The increase of 1,541,000 bushels was probably not as large as expected.

Private advices from the Pacific coast through all sellers. Loans took profit on 10,000 bushels of wheat in the state of Washington.
