

Bryan Suspends Sentence Given National Guard

Lincoln, Sept. 22.—Governor Bryan, acting as commander-in-chief of the Nebraska National guard today, approved the finding of the court martial which finding Private Chester Strubb \$50 for insubordination and assaulting an officer, but sentence was suspended by the governor during court behavior. Private Strubb of Company I, One Hundred and Thirty-fourth infantry of Lincoln, was tried for disrespect and conduct unbecoming a soldier and assaulting a superior officer, Capt. Harry K. Grainger, also of this city, on last April 10, at the army here. He was found guilty at a general court martial, over which Maj. Marcus L. Pottet sat as judge advocate general and was fined \$50. The maximum sentence on the charge is a fine of \$200 or 20 days in jail and dishonorable discharge, which would mean loss of citizenship.

Osceola Forms Good Will Legion To Promote Americanism and Respect for Law—No Secret Order.

Citizens of Osceola, Neb., have organized the American League of Good Will. The object of this organization, as told in its constitution, reads: "The object of this organization shall be to unite loyal Americans in an effort to develop an intelligent and intense devotion to America, her needs, ideals, principles and institutions; to banish the spirit of bolshevism and all its ramifications; to respect for law and order and regard for each other as fellow citizens of the republic; but not to engage in or be involved in matters of party politics or sectarian religion. Nor shall there be any secret work or forms of association in the conduct of the organization." All members are required to take the following pledge: "I will deal with my fellow citizens at all times and under all circumstances on the basis and in the spirit of good will. Especially, I will seek fairness and justice in all transactions and will uphold the laws and seek redress for my wrongs in lawful ways. I will do whatever is in my power to expel the spirit of bolshevism, and to teach true Americanism. These things I will do for the sake of the republic."
