

15,000 Sheep in Single Shipment

Henry Moss, Utah Ranchman, Brings in Whole Train Load of 50 Cars.

One of the largest shipments of sheep to the local market in several years was brought in yesterday when Henry Moss, secretary and treasurer of the Deseret Livestock company of Woodcroft, Utah, arrived with 15,000 head of ewes and lambs, which were consigned to Melady Brothers, who have received several hundred thousand sheep from the west so far this season.

The sheep brought in by Mr. Moss made up a train of 50 cars and consisted of lambs, ewes and sheep of good quality, averaging 87 pounds, and sold for from \$12.50 to \$13.25 a hundred as feeders.

Mr. Moss is a native of Utah and has shipped to the local market for the past 20 years, livestock of all kinds. Besides being extensive sheep raisers the Deseret Livestock company has 2,500 head of cattle on feed that will be shipped to the local market soon. The company has 60,000 breeding ewes on pasture, 180,000 acres of range and ranch land and this year put 8,000 tons of hay.
