However, the expectation that refiners might soon enter the market stiffened holders and Cubas were firm at 5%c cost and freight, equal to 7.86 duty paid. No sales were reported. Raw sugar futures were firm all day, reflecting the situation in spot sugar. The market opened 6 to 9 points higher, with December later advancing from 5.15 to 5.21 on Wall street and trade buying, and the close firm, at the top showing five to 19 points net rise, near months leading. October closed 5.9; December 5.21; March 4.10; May 4.18.

In refined sugar there was little new demand, but as stocks are sight, it was expected that buyers would shortly appear. The list prices on fine granulated centinued at 9.15 to 9.10. Colorado beet refined, for the first time since the war, is being offered as far east as the Buffalo-Pittsburgh district.
