

2 Chinamen, Each 77 Years Old, See Rail Train for First Time

Lewiston, Ida., Oct. 18.—Although each has reached the age of 77 years, the first time Mah Yung and Pun Loi ever saw a railroad train was yesterday when they boarded it at the town of Green, 50 miles east of here, in coming to this city on the first leg of the journey to their native city, Canton, China. For 60 years the aged Chinese had been at the mining camp of Pierre

City, 35 miles from Greer, the railroad point, and this is the first time since entering the camp they had caught a glimpse of the outside world. Until two years ago they were engaged in placer mining, their age forcing retirement at that time. At one time there were 800 Chinese in

Pierre and after the departure of Mah Yung and Pun Loi but two remained. When heading for Pierre City in the gold rush days the Chinese walked the distance from Portland, Ore., almost 500 miles.

Doubting Thomas. New York, Oct. 18.—Joseph F. Rinn, Brooklyn ghost breaker, playwright and butter dealer, supported with \$5,000 cash his skepticism of Mrs. Jos. K. 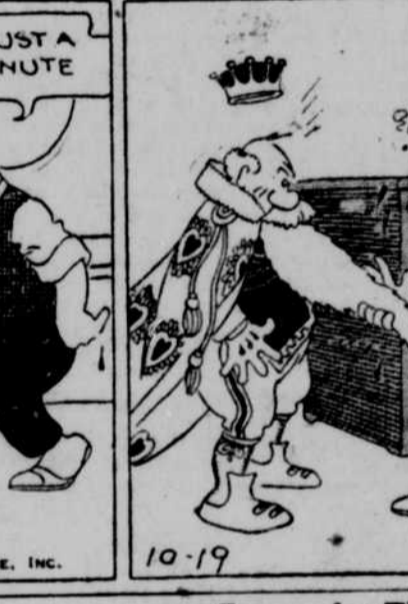
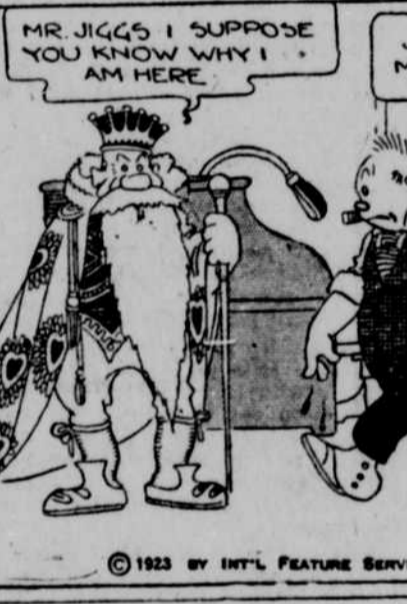
