The nervous strain following the denouement overtaxed her pow ers of resistance, the condition being aggravated by the fact that she is expected to give birth to a child within two months. The unborn little one. she has confessed, is the child of Clark, whose attentions she was directed by "messages from the stars," to accept without reserve.


