

Oil Stock Held by Theodore Roosevelt, jr.

Washington, Oct. 28.—Col. Theodore Roosevelt, assistant secretary of the navy, was questioned Saturday by

the senate public lands committee concerning the interest which his relatives had in the oil company of Harry Sinclair, at the time Sinclair obtained the drilling lease for the naval reserve field at Teapot Dome, Wyoming.

The committee is investigating the leasing of naval reserve fields to private interests by former Secretary of the Interior Albert B. Fall.

Colonel Roosevelt, who approved the leasing, told the committee that in 1916-17 he had been a stockholder in the Sinclair Consolidated Oil company; his brother, Archibald, is now

vice president and director in one of Sinclair's subsidiary companies and his wife, at the time Sinclair negotiated the lease, owned 1,000 shares of Sinclair stock, which she later disposed of at a loss.

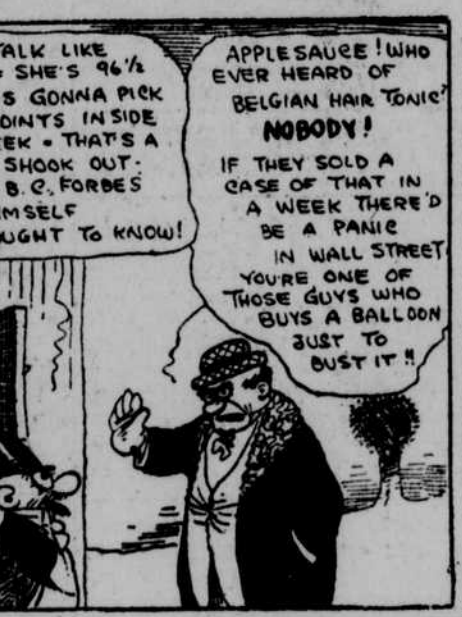
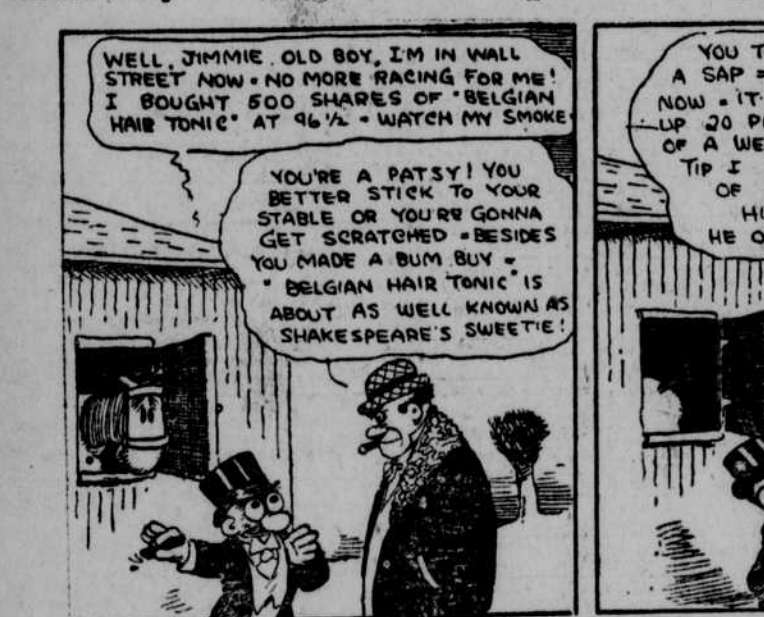

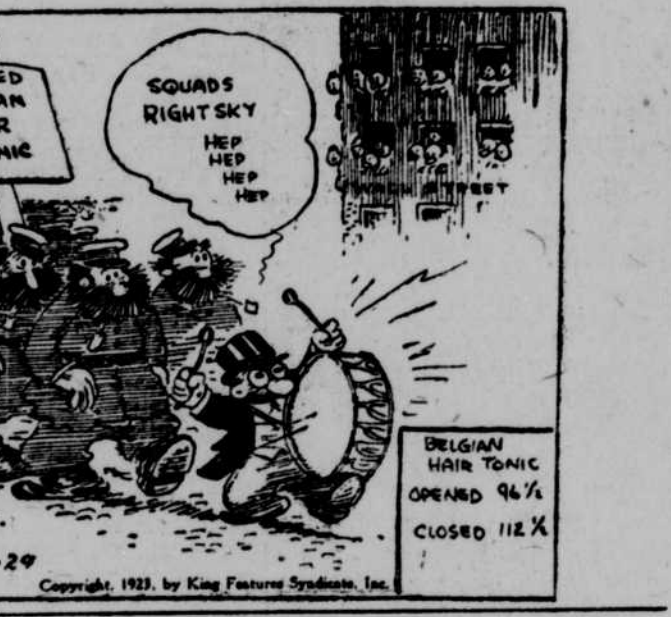
