frequently to mention "my chauffeur" or "my wife's French maid" or "one of my stable boys," naively intimating of course, that he has many servants. If you can express yourself without mentioning the servants at all you will be doing better. If you must mention them don't be too explicit as to which one.

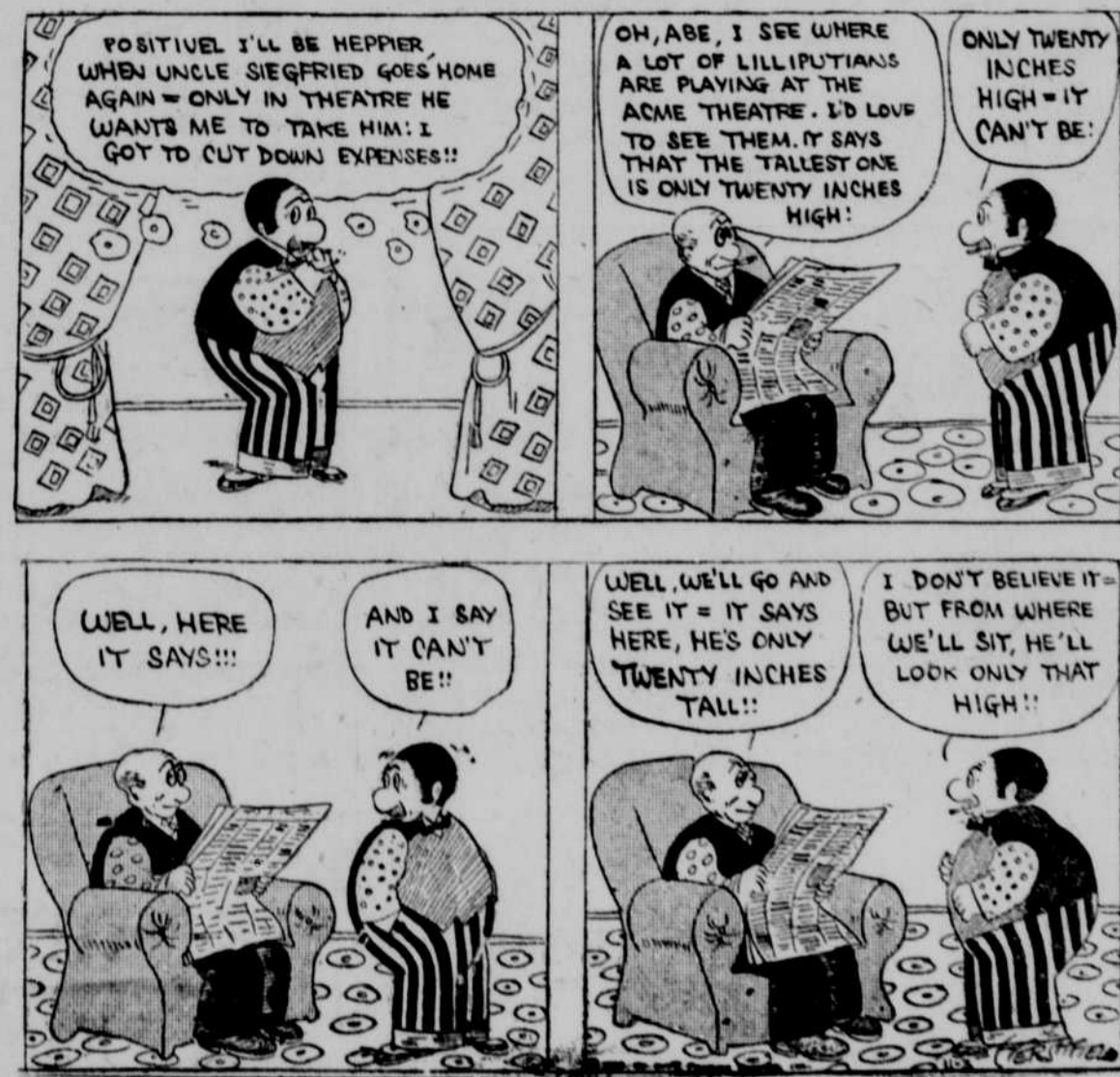
