Business sessions were devoted almost entirely to a consideration of the matter of bringing the Nebraska department of Veterans of Foreign Wars into a state department, it being as yet but a territorial status.

Adjutant General Elton was the guest and principal speaker before the Fremont Rotary club at today's noon luncheon. He advocated the idea of substituting the term "executive" for "extra service" and stressed the point that the opportunity for the service of the soldier did not end with the close of the war.

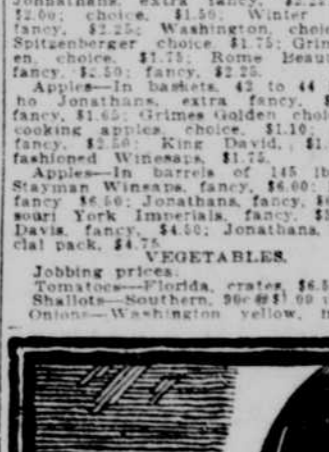
