

# Barney Google Challenges Zev, My Own to Race

Spark Plug Takes Great Showing in \$100,000 Stretch—Barney All Smiles.

Newton Falls, N. Y., Nov. 24.—Holding the lead in the first stretch of the great \$100,000 cross continental race near the city of Zev, My Own and Spark Plug, with Sunshine up, got a warm reception here as he rushed under the wire like a Yale back being jammed over for another touchdown.

Elated by the showing thus far made by Spark Plug, Mr. Google sent telegrams tonight to the owners of Zev, My Own and In Memoriam challenging the latter to special match races anywhere along, or near, the route of the \$100,000 cross continental classic.

"Sparky has run but a few hundred miles in this race thus far," said the smiling Mr. Google this evening. "He's just hitting his stride. Not until today did Sunshine have to put the bat to him. He's so fresh that I've wired my friends, Harry Sinclair, Admiral Grayson and Carl Wiederman, challenging them to enter their fancy miles in match races with my brown-eyed beauty."

**Long Distance Darling.**  
"Sparky is such a long distance darling that I can afford to take several hours off any time during the cross continental race and run him in a special event."

"If Zev, My Own and In Memoriam are not too tired after their recent contests, they ought to make Spark Plug extend himself over a mile and a few furlongs."

"Sunshine is just aching to show that he is another Isaac Murphy—a dandy in the wool black Sander."

While supervising the rubbing down of Spark Plug, Mr. Google put himself on record as strongly favoring match races between high class horses.

**"Too Tired" for Sparky.**  
"You can put it in big letters," Mr. Google concluded, "that the only fear I have now is that Zev, My Own and In Memoriam may be too tired to meet my Sparky. They are great horses, of course, but fragile. My Sparky is tougher than the Yale line, faster than the Cornell backfield, and the greatest passer in the world, not barring Notre Dame at its best. Indeed, if Spark Plug could play football, he'd be the all-American team himself."

Reporters were shooed from the stable as Sunshine soothingly began to sing his pet to sleep with the new terpsichorean spectacle, "Come On, Spark Plug."

The strains of that sprightly song were wafted into the local telegraph office as the boys were clicking off Barney Google's challenges to the owners of Zev, My Own and In Memoriam, and the sporting scribes were typing the latest news of the cross-continental epic.

**Prince May Get Paintings.**  
Philadelphia, Nov. 24.—There were definite agreements made relating to the return to Prince Youssouf of the two famous paintings formerly the property of Joseph E. Widener of this city, Mr. Widener's secretary, E. R. Winner, was quoted as saying last night. If they are complied with the paintings may be returned, Mr. Winner said.

Mr. Widener, he added, was not able to see the prince now and would be unable to see him in the immediate future. The secretary said Mr. Widener had not been in direct communication with Prince Youssouf and nothing further was to be said unless Mr. Widener's attorney decided to say something later. At the offices of the attorneys it was given out that all statements regarding the pictures should come from Mr. Widener or his secretary.

**Liquor Dividend.**  
Chicago, Nov. 24.—Witnesses for the government in the prosecution of 12 defendants for conspiracy to violate the liquor laws in connection with the distribution of the liquor firm of Grommes & Ulrich, and the propping of its liquor stocks among shareholders, today included Brig. Gen. Abel Davis.

General Davis said he had been approached by former Judge Charles Williams, one of the defendants, and that a deal was finally made by which Mr. Davis' brother and a friend took a share of stock and received a case of liquor. Mr. Davis said he was told the liquidation was legal in every respect.

**40 Bootleggers Held.**  
Memphis, Nov. 24.—More than 40 bootleggers were arrested last night in one of the most sweeping raids ever conducted here. The raiding officers are headed by government agents and assisted by city policemen. Rumor has it that Issey Einstein, the New York hoodlum, is working in Memphis and is responsible for the raids could not be confirmed, but it is said on good authority that he is here.

# Crooks Swindle Western Union

New York, Nov. 24.—Discovery that the Western Union Telegraph company had been systematically swindled of sums ranging from \$500 to \$700 through fake telegraphic money orders was followed by the arrest of Abraham Marks. Officials said they believed there was an accomplice among employees.

Marks, and perhaps others, the police said, might have gone on collecting money indefinitely had not a sharp-eyed official of the company noticed that an order-to-pay, en route to the cashier's desk, bore the title "Mr." which office regulations barred. Investigation disclosed that the order, believed to have been circulated by an inside accomplice, was a fake.

One check for \$550, obtained by a man misrepresenting himself to be C. C. Spaulding of Norfolk, Va., never was cashed. Police believe that when the real Spaulding, who is president of the North Carolina Life Insurance company at Norfolk, was at a Broadway hotel recently he was robbed of business documents which the swindler used to reassure the Western Union cashier.

**Won't Try Ludendorff.**  
Berlin, Nov. 24.—By a vote of 193 to 186, the reichstag last night rejected the resolution to try von Kahr, Ritter and Ludendorff for high treason as the result of the recent outbreaks in Bavaria.

Two other explosions, apparently of bombs, occurred shortly after 2 a. m., about a mile from the scene of the first blast. One of them wrecked the Sons of Italy bank at Twelfth and Tasker streets, and the other was in front of a building at Fifth and Dickinson streets.

The entire front of the consulate was blown out and window-panes in nearly every house in the block were shattered by the force of the explosion.

The bomb, concealed in a box the size of a suitcase, was left on the doorstep of the consulate and was picked up by Consul Emille de Motta, when he returned from the theater, and carried into the hallway.

The consul told police that he had concluded that the package might have been left on the doorstep by a passerby and that he thought best to replace it.

Not thinking it contained a bomb, he retraced his steps to the first floor and placed the box on the doorstep. He had hardly gotten into bed again when there was a terrific explosion. His room was badly wrecked, but Mr. De Motta was not injured beyond a severe shaking up.

The blast shook the Pennsylvania hospital, which is nearby, and caused some excitement among the patients. Consul De Motta said he had no idea who left the bomb.

The Italian consulate was located in the bank building.

# Bombs Wreck 3 Philly Houses

Philadelphia, Nov. 24.—A bomb was exploded yesterday on the doorstep of the Spanish consulate on Pine street. Scores of persons in the neighborhood were hurled from their beds, several being cut and bruised. No one was killed or seriously injured, the police said.

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# Friend Says Ford Is Willing to Run

Detroit, Mich., Nov. 24.—Henry Ford will run for president of the United States if nominated on an independent ticket, without a platform, Robert R. Pointer of Dearborn, lifelong friend of the automobile manufacturer said last night following a meeting of a committee arranging details of the Ford for President clubs conference here next month.

Mr. Pointer said he talked with Ford recently on the subject but declined to outline the nature of the conversation. "Mr. Ford did not tell me to desist in my efforts to make

him president, however," Mr. Pointer added.

Three hundred "volunteer" delegates are expected to attend the conference here December 12, William T. Kronberg, active Ford supporter, said following last night's committee meeting. Invitations have been mailed under the name of the Allied Ford for President clubs of Detroit, Dearborn and Highland Park.

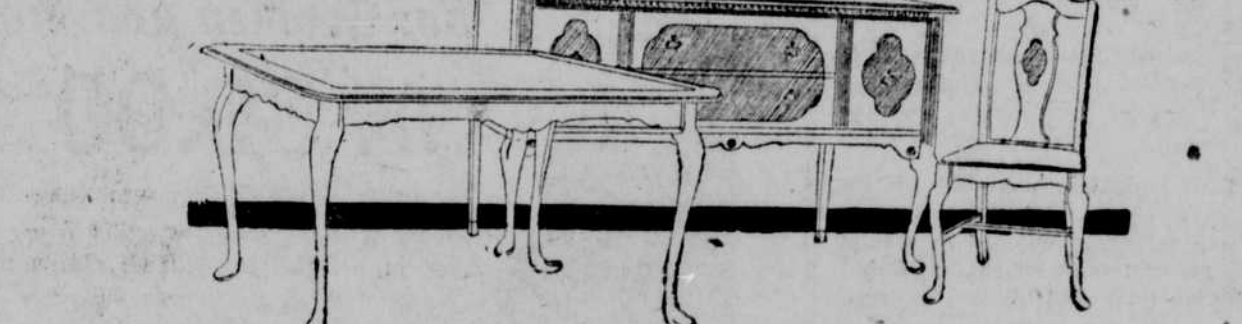

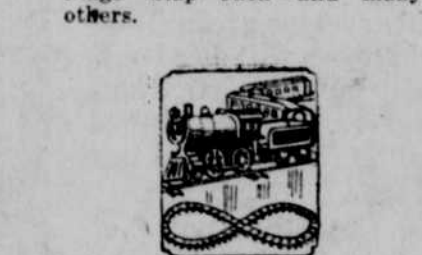
