One Shot Brings Down Entire Flock of Ducks

O'Neill, Neb., Nov. 28.—Friends of Leonard Hales, assistant cashier of the Platte River bank of Ewing, Neb., claim for him the medal for the most fearless single shot of the fall duck hunting season. Last Sunday while lying in a flyway with two other hunters, a flock of five butter-bell ducks came over Mr. Hales. They banked for a turn when they saw him and he knocked down all five with a single shot from his 12-gauge shotgun. Three of the ducks were killed outright and two crippled so that they could not get away. The ducks were shot while in full flight and not as they were rising from the water. Next to the teal, the butter-bell is the swiftest duck that flies.
