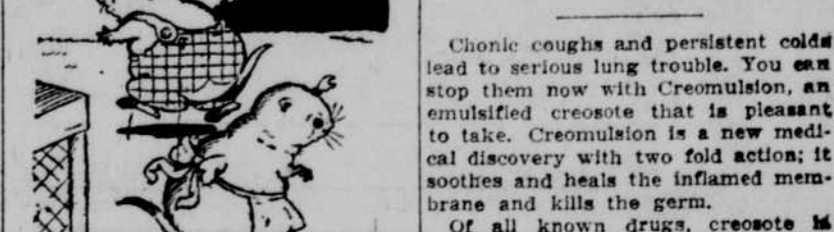


### December Cotton Breaks.
