London, Dec. 8 .- The spotlight of attention that used to be focussed upon Lady Astor as she sat in the house of commons-one little woman in the midst of 600 big, little and middle-sized men-will have to diffuse its beams to all sections of the cham ber when parliament convenes, fo there will be eight women to answer the roll, three conservatives, thre laborites and two liberals.

Lady Astor talked her Plymouth onstituents into sending her back to Westminster this week and so did the other two women who sat in the late parliament, Mrs. Margaret Wintringham, liberal, and Mrs. Margaret Philipson, conservative. Five other women won in fights with male opponents. Twenty-six of their sisters were beaten but considering the total number of candidates for the 605 seats the women who stood for parliament fared little worse proportionately than the men
