noon today. After the trial got under way, it was shown that three of the veniremen drawn for the November term of court, before the grand jury returned its indictments, were excused by the judge, and the sheriff was asked to draw three more to take their places.

The sheriff never made any return as to whether he had drawn the additional jurers or not. Consequently G. P. Robertson, clerk of the court was ordered to draw three jurymen which he did, making return in lega

#### Attorneys Clash.


