

Oppose Equal Rights Bill.

Washington, Dec. 13.—Opposition to the "equal rights" amendments sponsored by the National Women's party was voiced at the White House today by a delegation of women rep-

resenting women's organizations in the American Federation of Labor. The spokesman, Miss Anna Neary, told President Coolidge that 44 states have laws limiting the hours of labor for women in factories, mines and stores, that some states have mini-

mum wage laws protecting working mothers and that "there is scarcely a single state that has not some labor law which this amendment would probably destroy."

Ebert's Salary Reduced.

London, Dec. 13.—As a result of the salary cuts decided upon by the German government, President Ebert will receive only 1,500 a year and Cancellor Marx 1,750, according to the

Berlin correspondent of the Daily Express. The remuneration of ambassadors is to be 1,350 while member of the reichstag will get 1,170 for their services.

In emphasizing what the reduction will mean for the small officials, the correspondent says that grade crossing guards employed by the railways will be paid \$30 for a year's work.

Canes Come Back.

New York, Dec. 13.—Canes are coming back into their own as symbols

of martial stickiness and all-around masculine savoir faire. A few years back they had lost favor to the extent that they were worn largely by dandies and other extreme dressers. But within the last year or two they have been adopted by men in all walks of life.

A great many New York men carry canes to business. Wholesale dealers report that canes are undergoing a similar revival all over the United States. Down in South Carolina the seniors at the state university and Furman college have adopted them along with black derbies as hall marks of their upper class dignity.

**Soviet Boycotts Swiss.**

Moscow, Dec. 13.—The Russian soviet government today ordered a boycott of Switzerland.

Russia and Switzerland have been at loggerheads ever since the Lausanne conference when certain officials from Moscow were not allowed to enter Switzerland. The hostility was intensified by the acquittal of the assassin of M. Vorovsky, former Russian envoy to Italy, at Lausanne.

**Bonus Bill in House Again.**  
Washington, Dec. 13.—The soldier bonus bill, which passed congress last year and was vetoed by President Harding, was reintroduced today by Representative McKenzie, republican, Illinois, at the request of republican veterans in the house.

It carries only minor changes from the original bill.

**Ruhr Workers Storm Plants.**

Bochum, Ruhr Valley, Dec. 13.—Unemployed metal workers of the Bommacher Huette steel works, normally employing between 5,000 and 6,000 men, stormed and occupied the entire plant in protest against

the employers' policy of locking out the men, refusing to work 10 hours a day.

**Germany at End of Rope.**  
Berlin, Dec. 13.—The German chancellor's first reception of the foreign press representatives yesterday was an occasion of unrelieved gloom, keynote of his address being that Germany was absolutely at the end of its resources.
