

A Nebraskan in Washington

A pretty woman with bobbed hair, a skirt, a man's coat, a man's shirt, a man's hat and a man's cane walked into the office one day this week and asked where one of the Nebraskan's office companions could be found. When told to wait a bit, she pulled a cigar case from her pocket, offered the Nebraskan a cigaret, took one herself and then requested a match.

And such, at times is the east. This woman, it was learned later, was one of the best known correspondents in Washington for a big eastern news paper.

What, one wonders, would a business man, say at Hebron, Neb., do under such circumstances? The reason Hebron is listed is because not more than a dozen years ago a pretty young school teacher, a university graduate, went there to teach. To be short in description, she wore dresses with lower necks than was the custom in Hebron. The editor of one of the newspapers questioned the appropriateness of such garb in his editorial column. It wasn't until he was told that population figures showed there were three women to every man in Washington that Jack Lee perked up.

Edgar Howard is still battling 100 per cent in the publicity business. The latest is a column story in a New York paper, saying he looks like William Jennings Bryan and was the former Nebraskan's secretary. The writer evidently had looked deep into Edgar's eyes and described the eyes as twins to Bryan's. Then when it came to describing the two men the writer said that Edgar differs from Bryan in that Bryan is the tail of a comet while Edgar promises to be the comet itself.

Through the efforts of Congressman Bob Simmons, William A. Martinale of Elsie, Neb., a Spanish war veteran, has been made the recipient of a government check for \$1,725, representing back pay on a pension since November 18, 1897.

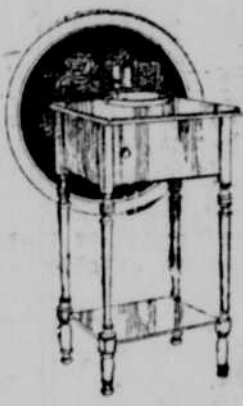

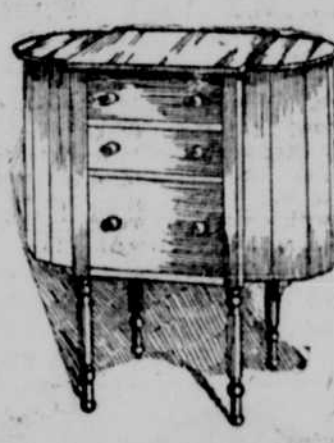

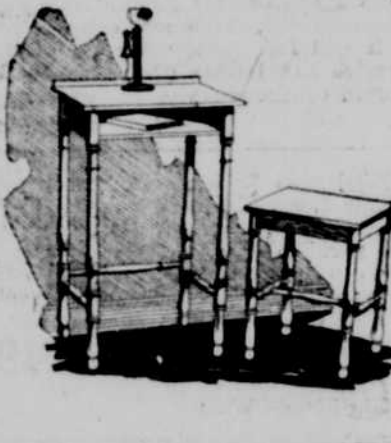

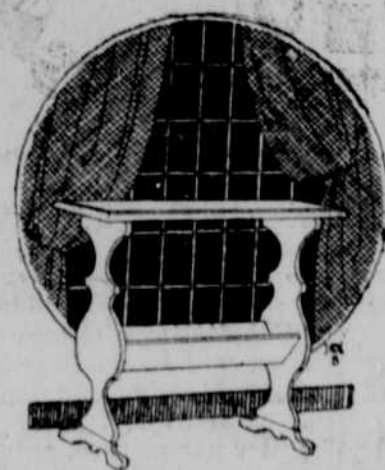

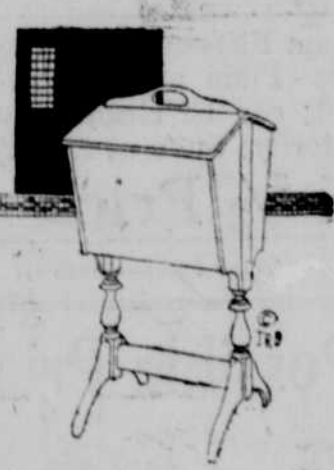
