## Even Prairie Silo Is Artistic

Walter Pach, art authority, concluded his series of four lectures before the Fine Arts society, Wednesday afternoon in the library galleries. In this lecture, Mr. Pach, who believes in the beauty and worth of post impressionistic and cubist art, traced these modern excesses from the classic via the impressionistic route. "The utilitarian objects of today will be the art of tomorrow. Our steel bridges, and buildings among them, 'a silo such as you westerners see on the prairie farm around you will be used as the final illustration in a four-volume history of art, which I am translating for a French author. When the Frenchman wrote asking me for the picture of a silo, I had considerable difficulty securing one, and found it finally in the catalogue of a concrete company. As an art form, the silo is the nearest approach to the columns of the Egyptian temples."
