### Mellon Asks Couzens If He Dodged Taxes

Secretary, in Open Letter, Reaffirms Statement High Sur-taxes Becoming Less Productive.

Washington, Jan. 25.—While republican house members were considering a proposal today to draft a tax bill of their own, using the Mellon plan as a basis, Secretary Mellon renewed his defense of his proposals in another open letter to Senator Couzens, republican, Michigan.

In his last letter to the secretary, the Michigan senator had challenged Mr. Mellon to tell the country what effect the Mellon plan would have on the personal taxes. The secretary's reply did not mention that subject, however, but instead again inquired whether the present high surtaxes had not impeded Mr. Couzens to invest a large part of his wealth in tax exempt securities.

Mr. Mellon also disregarded Senator Couzens' challenge to a joint de-bate on the Mellon plan.

### 15,000 Deaths by Auto Last Year

National Safety Council Recommends List of Preventive Measures.

Chicago, Jan. 25.—The National Safety Council today announced that 15,000 deaths were caused in the United States during 1923, by automobiles, outlined three recommendations which it said it could be applied in any city to bring a reduction in street accidents.

The recommendations are: 1. That traffic movement along main arteries and subsidiary channels be studied and traffic maps made so that traffic distribution and control may be made effective. 2. That city spot maps showing the place of every traffic accident be made so that local centers of hazard may be identified and proper treatment of conditions prescribed. 3. That the intelligent co-operation of every user of public streets be obtained through community organization and education directed at the development of safer conditions and conduct everywhere.
