"The Keck bill was approved April 21. Another bill dealing with the primary elections was approved April 26 in which reference is made to the election of the del egates to the county conventions ad it seems to be assumed that In your opinion did this latter bill repeal by implication the repeal of Section 2165 in the Keck bill?"

There shall be a primary election held at the regular polling place in each precinct on the second Tuesday in August, 1926, and every two years thereafter, except as other lowing sections, for the nomination of all the candidates except those exempted from the provisions of this article, to be voted for at the November election; also, delegates to the county convention.

Year-In the year 1924 and every four years thereafter the primar shall be held on the second Tuesday in April, at which time a preference vote for president and vice president of the United States as provided for in this article shall be had.

"House roll 247, page 209, laws of 1923, among other things provides: "The various political parties shall hold a county convention in each county on the third Thursday after the Tuesday upon which the general statewide primary is held, which coun ty convention shall, from its own membership, select delegates to the state convention, and transact such other business as shall properly come before it. Should any precinct fail at the primary to elect its quota of dele gates to the county convention, said convention shall have power to select such quota from the voters of such pjrecinct, and in like manner to fill eny vacancy that may occur; Provided, that any party whose candidate for governor at the last preceding election receive less than 20 per cent of the total vote cast for such office may select delegates to its county bonvention without regard to precinct representation, in caucus called for the purpose, which county convention shall select delegates to the state con vention on a basis authorized by the state committee of such party.

"Having authority by law for holding the county convention, as above forth, and there being provision for the election of delegates thereto, should the question be raised as to authority for apportionment of delegates from the various precincts it is my opinion that the present county central committees would be justified In determining such apportionment or quota, and would have such authority by inference in the absence of express provision of the law."


