

Mrs. McCormick Said to Be Tax Dodger

Chicago, Feb. 8.—Mrs. Edith Rocke-

fuller McCormick, daughter of John D. Rockefeller, sr., with Edwin Krenn and Edward A. Dato, her partners in a real estate firm, are made defendants in a suit for \$10,000 damages filed by Samuel Broker, consulting engineer and accountant, according

to the Chicago Herald and Examiner. According to the newspaper, the declaration states that last September Broker was employed by the defendants to devise a method to form a tax free organization in which Mrs. McCormick might invest \$15,000,000

in stocks and bonds. Broker conceived the idea of forming a "common law trust" which would obviate the necessity of paying federal taxes and Mrs. McCormick contributed \$5,232,000 and Krenn and Dato \$1,500

each to the trust, the declaration alleges. Broker claims he was to receive \$100 a day for his services and in addition a sum commensurate with the amount of the tax saved. He received the \$100 a day and \$1,250, he

says, but contends he should have been paid \$6,250. The earth is well explored now, and there isn't much left to discover but new sources of revenue.—Canton Reporter.

Bryan Insists Coolidge Act

Special Dispatch to The Omaha Bee. Lincoln, Feb. 8.—Governor Bryan sent an impatient telegram today to President Coolidge in which he urges the federal government to take action immediately against the oil industry and not merely to investigate.

"I am against investigation by the federal trade commission and the attorney general's office as outlined by President Coolidge in press dispatches," the governor said. "I have seen too many investigations which resulted in no action."

In his telegram he declared it is the duty of the government to take over the oil industry forthwith, to protect the public. He also refers to the "illegal and audacious efforts of the oil industry to control governmental action."

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Condemned Men Ask for Appeal

The two men are in the state penitentiary, pending the outcome of their appeal. If the state supreme court fails to find in their favor, they will be executed.

Russian-British Parley Arranged

London, Feb. 8.—Soviet Russia today accepted Great Britain's proposal for an Anglo-Russian conference to draw up a treaty between the two powers. It will be held in London and M. Ruzovsky, head of the Russian trade mission in Great Britain, will represent the soviet government. Great Britain already has accorded complete diplomatic recognition to Moscow.
