#### Navy Fund Bill Given to House

**Aviation Appropriation** Is Reduced.

By Associated Press.

Washington, Feb. 9.-The annual naval appropriation, carrying \$271, death car to Twenty-seventh and 942,867, of which \$30,000,000 would be available for completing more than a score of vessels now under account of trouble with his car, the construction, was reported today by the house appropriations committee. The bill provides \$117,000,000 for ay, enough to keep the navy at its resent strength of 6,469 officers and 86,000 enlisted men during the fiscal year beginning July 1 next. Provision also is made for 1,002 officers and 19,500 enlisted men in the Marine orps-the present strength.

For aviation the bill carries \$14,-590,000, or \$57,174 .less than last year's appropriation. The committee explained that it had slashed \$410,000 from the budget estimate for aviation on account of a development program recommended at Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, and Coco Solo, canal zone, County Grain Elevator waif, and Coco Solo, canal zone, which have not been authorized by law.
