"There is a feeling of hysteria among national leaders and a general lack of confidence throughout the west, due to deplorable conditions in agricultural sections," M. L. Corey, member of the farm loan board, told the bankers. "Any relief is only temporary until such a time as the prices of agricultural commodities shall reach a fair level.






