## **Merchant Fleet** Placed on Sale

Leviathan Included in List of 1,335 Vessels Advertised.

Washington, Feb. 28.-New terms and conditions under which the government would dispose of its entire merchant fleet, comprising 1,335 ves sels of various types, were announced today by the shipping board in a gen eral advertisement calling for bids. Records show that only a quarter of the whole tonnage now is in oper-

In announcing the call for bids the board said, the advertisement was designed primarily to comply with the law governing the sale of its property and was not "a sudden effort to force the sale of the board's fleet." It was in accordance with the "due advertisement" provision of the merchant marine act, it was explained. has been on a flat basis of \$30 a ton.

Displacing this provision, the board said it now was prepared to consider ous types, based on their relative value as effected by their desirability from point of design, physical condition at time of sale and other pertinent factors."

The vessels will be sold "as is, where is," exclusive of consumable stores, bunker fuel and submarine signal apparatus, or other leased equipment.


