

Wheeler Charges U. S. Oil Men Aid Revolt in Mexico

Witnesses Subpoenaed From Southwest Expected to Reveal Conspiracy With Doheny at Bottom.

Washington, March 8.—Witnesses subpoenaed from the southwest by a senate committee investigating Attorney General Daugherty will be asked about the alleged activities of American oil interests in promoting the present Mexican revolution.

Senator Wheeler, democrat, Monday said today he expected to prove that former Secretary Fall and the Doheny and Sinclair oil interests participated in a conspiracy to further a revolt.

The witnesses will be asked, Senator Wheeler said, whether these interests participated in violations of American neutrality by the shipment of arms and ammunition across the border.

He declared former Department of justice agents would testify that they were ordered from Washington to stop the work of breaking up gun-running across the border.

"We expect to prove," said Senator Wheeler, "that the violations of neutrality in the furnishing of arms and munitions to the revolutionists was done in pursuance of an agreement between some of the revolutionary leaders and the oil interests in the United States."

A leak in Texas on the names of the witnesses subpoenaed is being investigated by the committee, Senator Wheeler said. That undoubtedly the committee's hand had been tipped through disclosure of information regarding subpoenas which went through the office of United States Marshal D. A. Walker at San Antonio.

A subpoena probably will be issued today for Gaston B. Mison, former Department of Justice operative, indicted in New York yesterday on a charge of conspiracy to bribe the attorney general and others.

Bostonian Looks for "Soulmate"

In contrast to this letter is one received by Mrs. Stull from a lonesome bachelor in Alaska. This man would have a mate who loves the outdoors and the "great open spaces."

He promises her, his letter states, scenery more beautiful than that painted by the greatest artists and excitement more enjoyable than the bright lights of Gotham's gay Broadway.

The club's founder and president has made this work her hobby and answers all her mail personally. She never promises her correspondents she will find them mates, but does agree to try to do so.

She has received as many as 800 letters from all parts of the country in one month. She weeds out the frivolous and answers the others; for, she says, "If I can make two people happy, then I have done a great good."

British Living Costs Mount

London, March 8.—The high cost of living problem is still on the tapis in England.

The Ministry of Labor Gazette announces that the average level of retail prices of commodities, including fuel, food, rent and clothing, is still 77 per cent above that of 1914 and has increased 2 per cent in the last month.

Food prices alone have increased 3 per cent in the last month.

A distinct upward trend in living costs is shown by ministry of labor statistics, the upward movement starting in June and progressing rapidly throughout the autumn months.

Texas Starts Roundup of Its Quack Doctors

Sweden Seeks Slash in Cost of Its Army

By Associated Press. Stockholm, March 8.—Swedish politicians are busily engaged in the solution of the problem of national defense, which is the weightiest before the country.

The problem has assumed such importance that political leaders have been touring the country speaking on the subject, and expounding their various methods for reducing the cost without reducing the safety of the national defense.

The socialist and liberal parties advocate curtailing the period of training, the socialists asking a reduction from 250 to 150 days, and the liberals to 200 days.

The cabinet recently decided upon a new uniform for the army of an olive drab color, in the place of the present gray, and cut somewhat after the American army uniform. A helmet for field use of the Franco-British type will be substituted for the Boer hat.

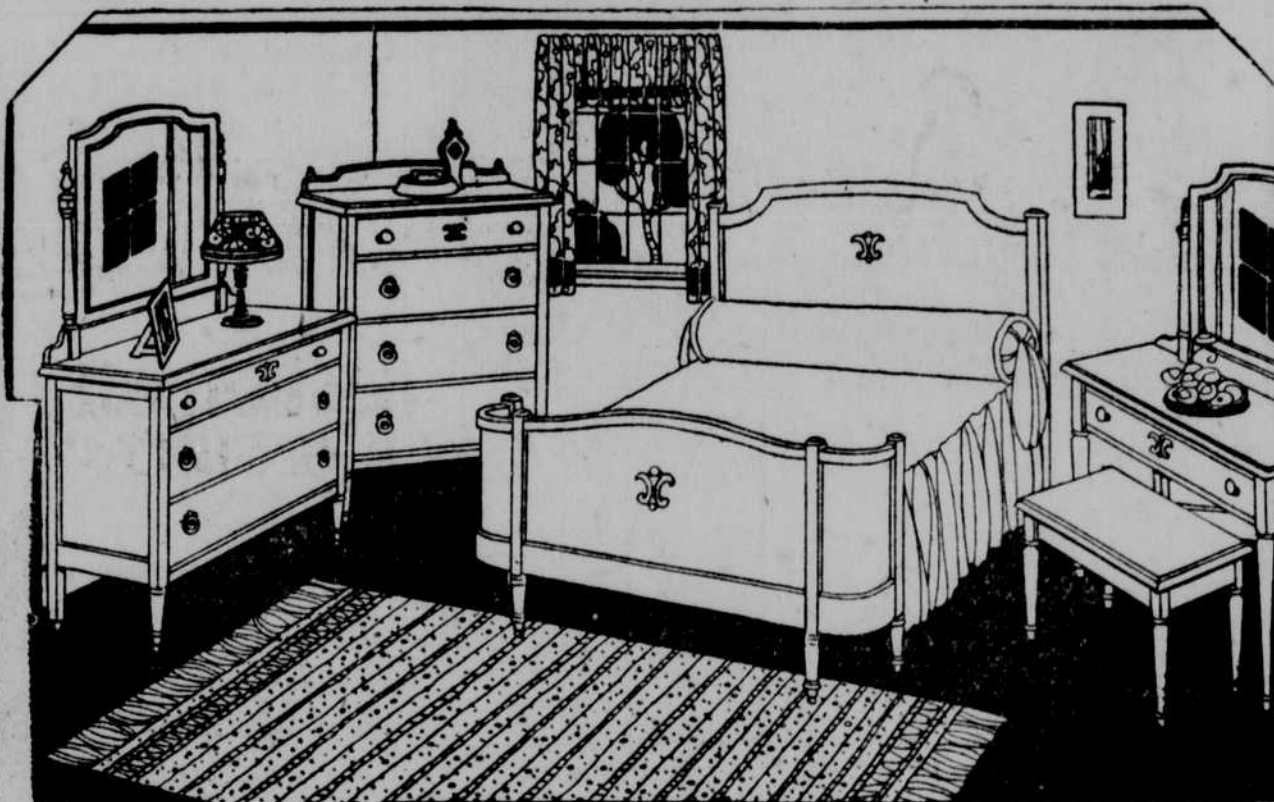
