

Solon Seeks to Protect Farmer Selling-Bodies

Agriculturists Given Right to Withhold Products to Create Demand by Amendments to Iowa Bill

Des Moines, March 8.—Representative Children of Pottawattamie county does not wish to take any chances with the recognized right of farmers' organizations to agree to withhold from the market any farm product for the purpose of creating a greater demand or stabilizing the price.

He has offered an amendment to the bill covering pools and trusts, under which farmers' or other cooperative buying and selling organizations, formed to obtain a fair price for farm products or to obtain necessities for the farm at fair prices, would be exempted from the operation of that law.

It was the same bill to which Mr. Children had previously offered an amendment under which the executive council or city councils might, with state or municipal funds, establish selling agencies for commodities in which combinations seek to raise prices unreasonably.

The amendment was aimed at what the author feels unwarranted increase in the price of gasoline. Sentiment in the house and also in the senate, seems to favor both amendments.

It has been reported within the last few days that the attorney general's department is supporting the latter amendment, as a means by which the state might attack undesirable combinations.

The bill, number 211, is to be taken up immediately in the house, unanimous consent having been granted to call it up in advance of action in the senate, where it would otherwise originate under the division of bills at the beginning of the session.

"Then you really have accomplished nothing so far," the county attorney was asked.

"Oh, no, we have progressed. We have discovered four new clues, two of which cannot be divulged at present."

"How about the other two?" "Well, we can't give out these, either."

Senate Ignores Poincare's Demand

Paris, March 8.—The senate last night by a show of hands fixed upon Thursday, March 13, for its next sitting, although it had been supposed it would accept the ultimatum of Premier Poincare to the senate finance committee that he would resign unless the government's financial measures were immediately approved.

Poincare learned with surprise of the senate vote. He immediately conferred with his colleagues, and they decided that he should attend the meeting of the senate finance committee today. It is expected he will then repeat his ultimatum.

Poincare Invites Deputy to Duel

But What Premier Thought Insult Wasn't—So Fight Called Off.

Paris, March 8.—Premier Poincare is not going to fight a duel with Deputy Gaston Le Provost de Launay, although there were prospects of such an encounter last evening.

The premier challenged De Launay after an incident in the chamber of deputies in which a remark by De Launay was taken by M. Poincare as a reflection upon him. The seconds who were immediately appointed, found the deputy's words had been misunderstood during the heat of debate.

"Such Perfidy."
In a speech the premier had referred to an allegation made by Paul de Cassagnac that Georges Mandel had applied to him and M. De Launay to get the support of Prince Napoleon for Mandel if he should be a candidate for parliament from Corsica.

De Launay interrupted M. Poincare with the shout: "I hope you do not make yourself responsible for such perfidy." It was an incident such as occurs daily in the chamber, and no importance was attached to it at the moment.

All Explained.
The premier, however, appears to have caught only the word "perfidy" and it rankled. He called War Minister Maginot and Colonial Minister Sarraut and asked them to second him. He considered he had been grossly insulted and that he had no alternative but to demand an explanation or satisfaction from De Launay.

In accordance with the code of honor, De Launay referred the ministers to Deputies Boutton and Tattinger. Careful examination of the transcript of the stenographic minutes satisfied the four seconds that there were no grounds for a duel and the incident was declared closed.

Coolidge Backs 1923 Tax Cut

Washington, March 8.—Endorsement by President Coolidge of the proposal to remove the provision for a 25 per cent reduction in personal income taxes payable this year from the revenue bill and enact it in a joint resolution before March 15, when first installments are due, stirred up a new tax fight in the house Friday.

President Coolidge supported the argument of the treasury that the provision would eliminate confusion resulting from refunds which would be necessary if the reduction were approved after the first installments have been paid.

Peony Show at Des Moines.

Des Moines, March 8.—Plans for a national peony show to be held in the Coliseum here some time in June were in progress today.

Committees recruited from peony lovers will be appointed from all parts of the state to make reports and present plans for definite work looking toward staging the event.
