Rules Property Owner Can Not Get Damages After Plane Made Forced Landing.

St. Paul, March 8 .- The old common law maxim "whose the soil is. his it is from the heavens to the cenths of the earth." was overruled decision by Judge John Michael, of the tof Minnesota, the District suit for damages brought by a lo cal property owner after an airplane made a forced landing on his prop erty. The plaintiff sought also to enjoin the defendant from flying over his property regardless of the alti-

tude of such flights. "The upper air is a natural heritage common to all of the people and its reasonable use ought not to be ham pered by an ancient artificial maxim of law," the juege declared.

The decision is regarded as great importance, according to L. K. Bell, secretary of the Aeronautical Chamber of Commerce, which repre sents some 1,200 commercial aircraft operators in the United States. It may be interpreted as a specific declaration of the freedom of the air whereby aircraft may fly over prep erty without being guilty of trespass. "Condemnation of air lanes is not

feasible because aircraft can not ad ere strictly to a defined course. Judge Michael's decision said. "The air, so far as it has any direct relation to the comfort and enjoyment of the land is appurtenant to the land, but to contend that it is part of the realty, as affecting the right of air void of substantial merit."

After Earthquake Blamed for Absence.

Tokio, March 8.-The schools of Tokio probably will be without the Building Ships usual contingent of Korean students, if present indications have anything to do with it. Prior to the great earth quake virtually every school of Tokic had its group of Korean students, young people sent to this country by their home districts for higher education. In the days following the earthquake excitement in the capital and elsewhere ran high, and hundreds of Koreans, charged with polsoning wells and attempting to spread members of the young men's associations and by groups of ex-cited youths. In many cases Chinese and even Japanese, mistaken for Koreans, met death at the hands of the half-crazed mobs.

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
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
