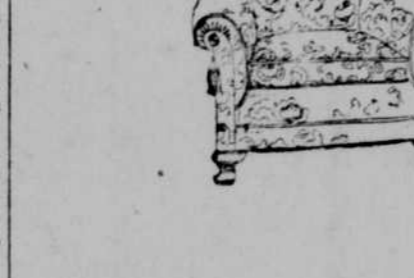
### Boy Scouts of Northeast Nebraska to Meet in April
