## Many Willing to Betray Jesus Now, **Declares Pastor**

Thousands, Like Judas, Deny Christ Because Allegiance Inconvenient, Says Rev. George Dorn.

To meet Christ is not merely an opportunity, but a crisis; it is necessary that men and women be impressed and influenced when they come into the Savior's presence, according to Rev. George Dorn in his Sunday morning sermon at Kountze Memorial church. Rev. Mr. Dorn. who spoke on "The Great Betrayal," said in part:

"Judas Ischariot can never fall to be an interesting subject to those who love character study. We see in him the conflict of rival forces, transforming love drawing him one way and selfishness leading him another.

"His life was full of contrasts. On the one hand infinitely glorified by the statement that he was 'one of the twelve,' and on' the other hand hope lessly banished by the Master's own verdict, 'Woe unto the man.' What an illustration of the Biblical warning 'Let him that standeth take heed lest

"Judas was permitted to listen to the Sermon on the Mount. He was a witness to the most marvelous events that were ever recorded in the annals of men. How many a nobleminded man and how many a purehearted woman would have given half their lives for one day in the comanionship of the Christ! 
