

La Follette Favors His Nomination for Presidency

Third Party Planning to Bolt the Republican Convention Should Reactionary Program Be Adopted.

Washington, March 17.—Senator La Follette of Wisconsin will accept a third party nomination for the presidency if the republican convention at Cleveland next June nominates President Coolidge and adopts a "conservative" platform. Senator La Follette is discouraging his friends from making a fight for him in the republican convention, but has indicated to them that should the Cleveland nomination and platform be reactionary from the viewpoint of his group he will not look with disfavor on a third party nomination.

Washington, March 17.—Should President Coolidge be the republican nominee at Cleveland, and should a reactionary platform be adopted, friends of Senator La Follette predict that the Wisconsin delegation, after the defeat of the substitute platform which it will offer, will walk out of the convention. They hope that other state delegations also will withdraw.

Inquiries have already been made in all the states to develop what obstacles there would be to such a program, and reports have been made that the greatest difficulties would be encountered in New York state. These would not, it is said, be insurmountable.

By Associated Press. Madison, Wis., March 17.—The platform of the La Follette progressive republican delegates, as made public today, pledges "complete house cleaning in the Department of the Interior and other executive departments."

"We demand that the power of the federal government be used to crush private monopoly, not to foster it," continues this plank.

Cognizance also is taken of recent developments in the Washington investigations.

"We pledge recovery of the navy's oil reserve and all other parts of the public domain which have been fraudulently or illegally leased or otherwise wrongfully transferred to the control of private interests; vigorous prosecution of all public officials, private citizens and corporations that participated in these transactions; complete revision of the water power act, and all other legislation relating to the public domain. We favor public ownership of the nation's water power and the creation and development of a national super-water power system, and strict public control and permanent conservation of all the nation's resources in the interest of the people."

Public Ownership of Rails. The platform declares for the repeal of the Esch-Cummins railroad law and the fixing of railroad rates on the basis of actual, prudent investment and cost of service.

It is declared that public ownership of railroads "with definite safeguard against bureaucratic control" is "the only final solution of the transportation problem."

Reduction of federal taxes on individual incomes and legitimate business is proposed and it is suggested that "the \$300,000,000 now annually expended for the army and navy in preparation for future wars" be curtailed.

It is also proposed that "hundreds of millions stolen from the treasury through fraudulent war contracts and the corrupt leasing of the public resources" be recovered.

Denouement Mellon Plan. "Diligent action to collect the accumulated interest upon the \$1,000,000,000 owing us by foreign governments," is advocated.

"We denounce the Mellon plan," says the platform, "as a device to relieve multimillionaires at the expense of other tax payers and favor a taxation policy providing for immediate reductions on moderate incomes, large increases in the inheritance tax rates on large estates to prevent the indefinite accumulation of inheritance of great fortunes in a few hands; taxes upon excess profits to penalize profiteering and complete publicity, under proper safeguards of all federal tax returns."

U. S. Rejects French War Debt Proposal

Washington, March 17.—The United States, in a formal note to Ambassador Jessurand, made public here today by the State department, rejects the suggestion of the French government for the creation of an international agency to deal with questions arising out of relief credits extended to European countries during and just after the world war.

Candidate for Pulpit Speaks at Westminster

Rev. Robert Karr of Boulder, Colo., candidate for the pastorate of the Westminster Presbyterian church, Thirty-third street and Woolworth avenue, filled the pulpit of the church Sunday.

Former German Prince Sells Farm Machinery

London, March 17.—The former German crown prince is selling farm machinery and is living at the home of his brother, Eitel Friederich at Potsdam with his wife and family, according to the Daily Mail's correspondent.

Ultimatum Given China by Russia

Moscow Demands Ratification of the Recognition Pact.

Moscow, March 17.—The Chinese government, having declined to ratify the agreement for resumption of relations with Russia, has been warned by the soviet government that Russia will wait only three days for ratification.

The news that the Chinese government had declined to ratify the signature of its delegate, Dr. Wang, to the preliminary agreement with the soviet representative, M. Karakhan, for the resumption of diplomatic relations, reached Moscow in a Peking dispatch which declared that M. Karakhan had informed the Chinese secretary that Russia would wait only three days for ratification.

American, French and Japanese pressure upon the Chinese government is declared by the Russian correspondent in Peking to be the cause of China's attitude.

On Sunday the Russian public had long editorials spread before it, expressing joy over the success of the Russian policy in the east, as though the rapprochement with China was an accomplished fact. This afternoon the public was suddenly informed through newspaper headlines announcing "Russian ultimatum to China," that the fact was not yet accomplished.

Anti-Saloon League Demand Firm Stand

At a special meeting of the Anti-Saloon league committee on candidates the following resolution was adopted:

"In the coming campaign we are vigorously opposed to any candidate who does not stand squarely for prohibition and the legislation to make it effective and who does not stand squarely against any modification of any law that would weaken its enforcement.

"We believe that any modification of the present prohibition law, which would permit the sale of light wine and beer, would bring about a condition immensely worse than when we had the open saloons, and we are, therefore, opposed unalterably to the settled campaign of the wets to accomplish this end."

Island Landlords Killed.

Manila, March 17.—Dr. Sampson and his brother-in-law, Jacinto Guadalupe, landlords, were hanged to death and five tenants shot dead in a pitched battle between the landlords and tenants at Candaba in Hampanga province over a sugar crop dispute, according to reports reaching here today.
