Jeffries, laborer for the Union Pa cific railroad here, came to his death through blows with a blunt weapon County Attorney L. A. Bevoe sai today. County Attorney Bevoe said the verdict did not specify that the weapon was a hammer, although a

hammer probably was used.

The verdict did not name any per son or persons as having been respon-

Alex Swantowski, arrested immedi ately after the discovery of Jeffries body in the burned ruins of his home is not charged with the murder, the county attorney said. Swantowski was reported to have been seen in company with Jeffries shortly before the time of the murder, but is held on a charge of intoxication.

Bevoe said that two automobiles were reported to have parked in front of Jeffries' home the night of the fire, one at about 10 and the other an hour later. No one saw them

Lincoln, March 19.-State Sheriff Tom Carroll said this afternoon that he had not received a request from authorities in Keith county, asking him to investigate the mysterious murder of John O. Jeffries there last week. The state sheriff said, however, that he would send a man to Ogaliala to assist in the investigation if assistance from his depart-ment was asked by County Attorney






