

### Third Party Ticket Seems Uncertain

**Sullivan Believes Satisfactory Democratic Candidate May Halt Organization.**

Washington, March 19.—Whether or not there will be a third ticket of any effectiveness depends less on La Follette personally than on two other factors. Those factors are, first, who gets the democratic nomination; and second, how the public will feel by June 1 in regard to Coolidge's relation to the question of government house cleaning.

As to the last consideration, the hope of the republican leaders in Washington is that by June 1 Daugherty will have long been out, a new and satisfactory man will be in charge of the Department of Justice, and the public will be satisfied about that department. The republicans hope that by that time much of the motive for a third party may be dissipated.

The factor affecting the arising of a third ticket is the democratic nominee. Up until February 1 it had been the complete expectation of the progressives in the northwest that McAdoo would get the democratic nomination. McAdoo was satisfactory to them, and in the existence of that probability it was practically settled that there would be no third ticket. But the investigation revealed McAdoo was unsatisfactory to the third party people in the northwest. If the democrats should yet nominate some thoroughgoing radical of a kind to appeal to third party followers in the northwest, that might yet prevent an effective organization of a third party.

### S. Dakota Facing Artesian Drouth

**Great Resource to Be Total Loss Unless Conserved, Says Geologist.**

Pierre, S. D., March 19.—Unless prompt action is taken to shut down to proportions for required use the flow of artesian water in South Dakota, this great resource which has declined from a flow of 238,065 gallons a minute from 2,826 wells, to 57,020 gallons a minute from 6,581 wells in approximately the last 10 years, will be a total loss, according to Dr. Freeman Ward, state geologist. Recent survey of the diminishing number of these wells and retarding pressure of their flow prove that the danger is imminent, he said. In Davison county alone, in the heart of the artesian well district, the number of these wells dropped from 242, with a total flow of 11,764 gallons a minute, to a mere 19 wells producing only 70 gallons a minute.

Preventable waste of this water from excessive flow is the heart of this problem which must be attacked, Dr. Ward declared. The reservoir, instead of being replenished each year, as streams and rivers, is the slow accumulation of centuries. The supply is being drained away in degree much more rapidly than its present accumulation.
