You have noticed that little children dance comically when they are angry or pleased.

The fact is that our bodies and muscles are well developed, our minds poorly developed. So, in joy or rage, war or religion, when articulate thought fails us, we are very apt to "say it with dancing."

How would it be, since human beings are different, and their conceptions of what pleases divine power even more different, to let those dance that want to, those pray that want to pray, and those sing that want to sing. Omniscience above knows what they all mean and can sort out the good intentions.

Feed a rat on lard which contains no vitamins and the rat dies of starvation. Feed another rat on butter, containing many vitamins, it lives, gets fat and multiplies.

Many kinds of vitamins are known to science, producing different, necessary effects, but until now, all that science knew of the vitamins was that they existed and were necessary.

Now Dr. Walter H. Eddy of Columbia university, after years of patient work with his associates has "isolated" and identified the vitamin. "It is an organic chemical structure," says the learned man. "Composed of carbon, hydrogen, nitrogen and oxygen."

Scientists hope they will be able to manufacture vitamin. If so, human beings in their food, their shape, and their needs may change enormously in a few years. Experience teaches, however, that no change of any importance comes very suddenly in this world. It all seems to be mapped out in advance and comes about gradually.
