



The senate this afternoon also considered a few more amendments to the health bill, but a final vote on the measure was not reached. An amendment adopted increases the salary of the state sanitary engineer from \$2,500 to \$3,600 a year and stipu lates that that official shall devote all his time to the state service. Opposition came largely from Shinn of Harrison and Buser, who denounced all efforts to increase state expenditures




