

Bridal Party Ends in Jail; Groom Is Held

Youth Admits Another Wife, Bad Checks, Auto Theft; Carried Special Police Badge.

When Virgil Johnson, 22, 4806 Poppleton avenue, led Josephine Ralph, 18, 2763 South Ninth street, to the altar in Council Bluffs Tuesday, they failed to reckon with the patron saint of All Fool's day.

For their wedding celebration Wednesday night they were taken to jail.

After spending the first night of their honeymoon in jail, Josephine went into hysterics and Virgil made these admissions to police:

"Borrowed" Automobile. He posed as a shining example of masculine virtue.

He carried a special police badge and revolver.

He already has one wife and baby living at 4651 Mason street.

He "borrowed" an automobile belonging to the Advance-Rumley-Thresher company.

He left a trail of worthless checks to the amount of \$200.

The bride and groom were arrested in a downtown dance hall Wednesday night with Mr. and Mrs. Dean C. Nordin, 2439 Pratt street. The stolen automobile was parked out in front.

The quartet told officers they had spent the evening at the home of the bride's sister, Mrs. Charles R. Nordin, 2439 Pratt street, and later had gone to the dance hall.

The bride and the Nordin denied any knowledge of wrongdoings with which Johnson was accused by police.

They said they had been at a wedding dinner at the home of the bride's sister.

"I'm through," cried Josephine through her tears. "I'm going to start annulment proceedings as soon as I get out of here."

"I was already engaged when I met him, only a week ago."

"But he was too fast. He swept me off my feet. I agreed to marry him."

"He told me he was a member of an orchestra. But he wouldn't even play the piano for me. He said he was too tired. I can't imagine he did all those things police say he did."

Other Wife Would Help. Mrs. Johnson, the first wife and mother of the "bridegroom's" 17-month-old baby, called Detective Bob Heller by telephone to ask if she should appear at headquarters to file a complaint against her husband.

"I guess you won't need to," the detective told her. "There are almost enough complaints filed against him now."

Mrs. Johnson did not indicate whether she would sue for divorce, Heller said.
