

Ship on Rocks, Slowly Sinking

Hope Abandoned for Admiral Rodman, Aground on Canadian Coast.

Seattle, Wash., April 4.—There apparently is little hope of saving the steamship Admiral Rodman of the Pacific steamship company which grounded in a blinding snowstorm early today at Point Calvert on the British Columbia coast near Queen Charlotte sound, according to radio advices received here from the steamship Queen, a sister ship.

Calvert is to be sent to the aid of the Admiral Rodman later tonight. The Admiral Rodman is a wooden vessel of 1,161 gross tons.

Soldier Held in Slaying of Private at Fort Bliss

El Paso, Tex., April 4.—Private Alexander J. Majka, troop B, Eighth cavalry, was shot and killed at Fort Bliss this morning while he was working on a scaffold on the Eighth cavalry clubhouse. His home was in Chicago, service records show.

Slain Bandit Identified as Narcotics Smuggler

San Francisco, April 4.—Harry Stone, bank bandit, killed in the robbery of the bank of Hochelaga, Canada, last Tuesday was identified by S. E. Armstrong, special agent of the federal narcotic bureau here, today as Conrad Johnson, narcotics smuggler of international repute. Johnson disappeared from San Francisco in 1918 after he had been arrested on a charge of smuggling narcotics into the city. He forfeited \$10,000 bail.

Lost Love Fear Prompts Slayer

Wife Plays Phonograph After Shooting Down Male Admirer.

Chicago, April 4.—Woman's fear that the man whose love had led to sacrifice and shame was "through with her" led Mrs. Beulah Annan, 28, to shoot Harry Kalstead to death. This was the conviction of detec-

tives today when the prisoner, a willowy beauty with auburn bobbed hair, reversed the story that she had told to prevent the man from attacking her.

Mrs. Annan admitted that she had teased Kalstead about "another man."

"He said: 'If that's the kind of a woman you are I never want to see or hear from you again.' I shot him through the back when he turned away," she told police.

For three hours, held by fright at what she had done, Mrs. Annan was alone in her bedroom with the body, which lay slumped in a half-sitting posture against the wall.

Crew of Pirates Will Face Court

Tokio, April 4.—Reikichi Ezure and 35 of his followers who, after an unsuccessful hunt for gold in the Okhotsk region of Siberia, turned pirates, seized two Russian ships and it is charged, killed the crews, numbering 75 Russians, were indicted today for piracy on the high seas. All the defendants are Japanese.

The motive for the piracy, Ezure declared, was a desire to avenge the Nikolaievsk massacre of 700 Japanese by Russians in March, 1920.

After slaying the seaman, the only loot the craft offered was fish oil cargo valued at 60,000 yen. This was disposed of in Hokkaido. When the spoils had been divided the men scattered. All have been rounded up as a result of two of their number having turned informers.

Ezure and his companions will go on trial in Tokio late this month.

Crew of Pirates Will Face Court

Band of Japanese Marauders Rounded Up After Seizing Loot.

Washington, April 4.—Carroll Q. Wright, veteran chaplain of the navy, died at his home here today. He entered the service in 1885 and was stationed at the Norfolk, Philadelphia and San Francisco naval bases for many years.

First Montana Labor Bank Opens

Great Falls, Mont., April 4.—The first big labor bank controlled entirely by union labor in the state of Montana was opened in Great Falls this morning when the majority of the stock of the Northern National bank was turned over by former owners to the representatives of the Great Falls labor unions and the railroad labor organizations having headquarters in this city.

The labor organizations purchased \$70,000 of the bank's total capital stock of \$100,000.
