A New Gorilla.
Bertrand Russell.
Fighter.
Wolves Not Dogs.
Nonflying Duck.

Another gorilla is coming here, a lady coming along taking care of him. Such animals usually die of homesickness, their keepers say—shortly after they land. They die, perhaps, because of the unpleasant pressure on their feeble minds.

See this new gorilla if you can. Look at his huge jaw, big teeth, wide chest, arms and hands uncomfortably like your own.

Observe his terrific power and you will know why your breed rules the earth instead of his. He was so strong that it wasn't necessary for him to think. Your ancestors were so weak that they had to think or die.

They decided to think, and their descendants shot and caged the gorillas as easily as he would kill a fly.

You will read that Bertrand Russell, now here, favors the league of nations; thinks it cannot function properly until the United States comes in, and hopes that the United States will come in.

Mr. Russell puts an above propaganda and the league. Some don't. It may interest you to know what he said yesterday:

"I am bound to confess that if I were an American, I should probably not want to see the United States go into the league of nations, and might offer many reasons why the United States should not go into the league of nations."

When you hear Bertrand Russell called a pacifist, bear in mind that he is a fighting pacifist. He believes that fighting should be done mentally, but it is not likely that any man would excel him in either physical or mental courage in a moment of danger. He believes that war can be ended, but thinks the only agency that could end it at this moment, would be one of super-power, great enough to impose peace upon smaller nations by its own will.

Mr. Russell is no dreamer. He says frankly that England does not dare talk to France as she would like to talk, because France dominates the air. And when you ask him what he would do if he ruled British policy he doesn't say that he would sit down in pacifist fashion, and turn the other cheek. He says, "I would build a fighting air fleet equal to that of France."

On the whole, if you listen carefully to Mr. Russell while he is here, instead of talking at him, you will learn a good deal.

Baby Guy Stillman, little boy of whom you may have heard—lies in bed seriously injured, mangled by a big police dog, "the little boy's playmate."

Sooner or later adults will learn that the police dog was chosen to pursue criminals and tear them down, because he is closely related to the wolf, ferocious by nature and always dangerous.

No child is safe with a police dog, and for that matter others are not safe.

A wise citizen would no more let a police dog live in the neighborhood of his children than he would allow a wolf to run at large.

This applies to a less extent to some other dogs, but to police dogs especially. The worst of it is that the older they get, and the more attached the family becomes to them, the more dangerous they are.

Dr. Chapman, excellent scientific worker for the American Museum of Natural History, returns from the Andes mountains bringing a bird that brays like a donkey and a duck that can't fly.

Before amazement carries you away at the thought of a duck that can't fly, ask yourself how many human beings there are that can't think.

One concern tells young gentlemen in Chicago university it will do their thinking for them, at so much per "thought," and there is great indignation at that.

How many young gentlemen come out of universities with brains and thoughts as much alike as so

many little biscuits, fresh from the oven? How many that never went to college have their thoughts and "opinions" manufactured for them?

Major Putnam, a great book publisher, spends his 80th birthday at work. And there can be no more useful work than that to which Major Putnam has devoted so many years of his life. Thanks to him, tens of millions have read his books of high character, purpose and educational value.

To feed their stomachs is good work. To feed their brains is a thousand times more important. When their brains are fed they can attend to the rest of themselves.

Earnest men and women advocate a plan to combine many little country public schools in one big central public school, providing omnibuses at public expense to carry children that live far away. At first glance the idea seems excellent, and it may be excellent—since it would include teachers better paid, schools better built.

Something would be lost also. Those that remember the country school, with the wood box by the front door, the lane where the little girls walked, the field where the boys rushed shouting "inner, pitcher, ticker," at the recess hour, know that the simplest rural school house has qualities possessed by no other institution on earth. Fortunately, not all such schools will be done away with in any case.

Tenant Sues Farm Owner for Damages for Injury
Albion, Neb., April 4.—D. J. Gates has been sued for \$50,000 damages by James S. Stephens, one of his tenants. On January 26, the plaintiff alleges, he went into an outside cellar on the farm he occupied and while he was there the walls caved in, crushing him under a load of dirt. His injuries left him permanently paralyzed. He claims the accident was caused by negligence on the part of the defendant.
