### Electricity Aids Work of Doctor

#### Practically Every Improvement Known to Science Found in Offices.

A most interesting place is the offices of Dr. T. E. Sample, 106 Arthur Building, where practically every form of electrical and light treatment known to science is used for the treatment of disease.

Dr. Sample is using the high frequency or sometimes called the pneumonia treatment machine—the same as used by large hospitals and the United States navy. High frequency has been found successful in the treatment of various diseases, according to Dr. Sample. Results depend much on the skill and technique employed. Various equipment such as high frequency machines, Morse wave, air-cooled and water-cooled actinic lights, infra red, high-powered radiant lights, polysine, sinusoidal, tractor couches and vibrators are employed. The Abrams system is also used in detail as to diagnosis and treatment. No X-ray or radium is used. Dr. Sample makes no attempt to treat infectious diseases but practically every other disease of the human body, such as sinus trouble, cancer, tuberculosis, stomach, gall-bladder, rheumatic conditions and chronic cases are treated. The offices are open to the public, should anyone be interested in diagnosis and treatment. Public demonstrations are given every Wednesday afternoon at 2.

### Credit Bureau Acts as Safety Valve

#### Seventeen years ago the J. J. Cameron Credit bureau was put in operation in a small office, with 35 subscribers. The principal feature of the business was a credit-reporting system for securing and filing a complete record of all credit transactions, financial standing, income, and moral responsibility of credit customers.

Demand for this information by retail dealers in Omaha soon developed a system that covered the entire city, and business rapidly increased until received daily for credit information. The J. J. Cameron Credit Bureau has now on file over 120,000 complete records, showing the credit and financial standing of individuals in Omaha. Over 1,100 merchants are using this service, and their credit losses are reduced from 2 1/2 per cent to less than 1/2 of 1 per cent, said Cameron. In connection with this credit system the firm publishes a weekly removal list, showing all moves in the city and various changes made in buying and selling homes and other property.

(Continued From Page One) settlement of the mecum contracts in the occupied territory, which expire April 15, it is not believed likely that France will release their control, thus destroying the hopes of loans and overthrow the basis of the whole report.

In addition, the evil genius which has hovered over Europe since 1914 has arranged that the report be published just in time to become a political football in the election campaigns in both France and Germany. It is not likely that the present government will pass on the report, but will seek to leave the fateful decisions on the new government which will result from the elections. Decisions termed "insane." These elections in Germany will be most notable for the gains to be made by the nationalists who are campaigning for a rejuvenated Germany that will be able to resist its enemies. Nationalist circles, however, flatly reject the decisions as "insane," if the reports so far published are correct. If their gains are sufficient to give them a decided influence in the new government the report of the experts will very likely face rejection by Germany. Over the alternative to the rejection of the report, these circles are not clear, but there is no doubt that such action would bring new measures of force by France, the consequences of which in connection with nationalistic rule in Germany, cannot be foreseen. (Continued From Page One) tal 2,500,000,000 gold marks; for 1927-28, 2,000,000,000; and the experts believe 1928-29 will be a normal year without a loan with Germany able to pay a surplus of 2,500,000,000 gold marks to the allies from half of the customs duties taxes, and half of the capital tax on the gross receipts of the railways. This 2,500,000,000 the experts consider should be paid by Germany with an equal amount from then on yearly until they acquit themselves of the full debt, the total of which the experts leave to the governments to decide. Capacity Not Considered. But as this 2,500,000,000 will only pay the interest on the "A" and "B" reparations bonds, the experts conceive that Germany should institute a sinking fund for these bonds by further payments based on a four per cent prosperity index with the payments increasing in the ratio of prosperity. It is estimated that the German fortune will be doubled within 25 years.

It should be strongly emphasized that the committee has not considered the Germany capacity for payment, not a reparations, nor sanctions, while the entire fabric rests on French willingness to abandon the reparations system so laboriously built up in the Ruhr. The fact that the French are on the Rhine and Ruhr is entirely ignored by the experts. The committee headed by Reginald McKenna frankly states that they have failed in the purpose for which they were called—to bring back to Germany the German wealth cached abroad and which the committee values at \$600,000,000 gold marks. Their report states that it is absolutely impossible to devise a scheme to repatriate this money, the only way being to restore confidence among German investors in their own country.
