Credit Bureau Acts as Safety Valve Furnace Firm



Seventeen years ago the J. J. Cameron Credit bureau was put in opertion in a small office, with 35 subscribers. The principal feature of the isiness was a credit-reporting system for securing and filing a complete record of all credit transactions, financial standing, income, and moral reonsibility of credit customers.

Demand for this information by retail dealers in Omaha soon developed a system that covered the entire city, and business rapidly increased until an office force of 12 people is now required to handle the hundreds of calls received daily for credit information.

The J. J. Cameron Credit bureau has now on file over 126,000 complete secords, showing the credit and financial standing of individuals in Omaha. devoted to the repair and overhauling Over 1,100 merchants are using this service, and their credit losses are reuced from 2½ per cent to less than ½ of 1 per cent, said Cameron.

In connection with this credit system the firm publishes a weekly re moval list, showing all moves in the city and various changes made buying and selling homes and other property.

tal 1,500,000,000 gold marks; for 1927. 28, 2,000,000,000; and the experts believe 1928-29 will be a normal year without a loan with Germany able to pay a surplus of 2,500,000,000 gold marks to the allies from half of the customs duties taxes, and half of the capital tax on the gross receipts of

the railways.
This 2,500,000,000 the experts consider should be paid by Germany with an equal amount from then on yearly until they acquit themselves of the full debt, the total of which the experts leave to the governments to

Capacity Not Considered. But as this 2,500,000,000 will only pay the interest on the "A" and "B" reparations bonds, the experts conceive that Germany should institute a sinking fund for these bonds by further payments based on a four per cent prosperity index with the pay ments increasing in the ratio of prosperity. It is estimated that the German fortune will be doubled within

It should be strongly emphasized that the committee has not considered the Germany capacity for payment not a moratorium, nor sanctions while the entire fabric rests or French willingness to abandon the reparations system so laboriously built up in the Ruhr. The fact that the French are on the Rhine and Ruhr is entirely ignored by the experts. The committee headed by Reginald McKenna frankly states that they have failed in the purpose for which they were called-to bring back to Germany the German wealth cached abroad and which the committee val ues at \$,000,000,000 gold marks.

Their report states that it is abso utely impossible to devise a scheme to repatriate this money, the only way being to restore confidence smong German investors in their ow




