New York, April 8.—A break of 1/20 per pound occurred in the raw sugar market today, due to increased offerings from Cuba, following continued heavy receipts. Spot prices are now quoted at 6.53c, duly paid. Sales included 25,000 lags of Cubans at 6.59c and 40,000 bags at 6.53c, all for April shipment. The decline in spots and the Department of Commerce estimate placing the world's sugar productions this year at 21,500,000 short tons, a new high record, caused active general selling of raw sugar futures. Houses with Cuban connections were the principal sellers, closing prices showing 15 to 25 points net lower. May closed at 4.70c, July at 4.86c. September at 4.85c and December at 4.31c.

Demand for refined sugar was checked by the sump in raws, although no changes were reported in quotations, which ranged from 5.20c to 8.40c for fine Refined futures were nominal.

Chicago, April 8.—Prices in the butter market today were ½c to 1c lower on all wrades. The market continued weak and duil following the decline, with buyers showing practically no interest. Receivers offered all grades freely and some were willing to make liberal concessions. The centralized car market shared in the weakness and offered freely at liberal prices. Trade was quiet.
