

Cello Here Bears Autographs of War Dignitaries

Instrument Owned by Engelbert Roentgen, Who Is to Lead Orchestra Here.

One of the most interesting war souvenirs ever shown in Omaha is the "Roentgen war cello," which is to be on exhibition in the corner window of the Burgess-Nash store, beginning Saturday morning.

This war cello is the property of Engelbert Roentgen, first cellist and assistant conductor of the Minneapolis symphony orchestra, "guest conductor" for the new Omaha symphony orchestra who will arrive in Omaha Monday to rehearse for the opening concert at the Auditorium May 9.

Roentgen was born in Amsterdam, where he received his musical education, achieved fame in Europe as a cellist and conductor and then came to New York in 1915 to join the Damrosch orchestra.

In 1918 he joined the field artillery of the 77th division, which was sent to France, where he took part in a number of important engagements.

His musical talent was soon discovered, and when General Alexander of the 77th division formed a theatrical unit of 25 professional actors, musicians and entertainers known as "The Argonne Players" he became a member and gave performances all over France for more than 2,000,000 soldiers.

He conceived the idea of having the names of officers and boys of his division autographed on the back of his cello and on the sides he wrote his diary from the day he entered the United States army until his honorable discharge in Hoboken.

Many of the leading celebrities in Europe at that time heard of the celebrated "Roentgen war cello" and added their signatures. Among these were President Wilson, who wrote his name "Woodrow Wilson" on the face of the cello, General Wood, Margaret Wilson, Foch, General Pershing and General Alexander, for whom he played again and again.

This cello has been exhibited in a number of cities and on several occasions police had to assist in keeping the gazers moving.

Roentgen not long ago refused an offer of \$10,000 for this souvenir. Collectors of souvenirs and relics prophesy that in years to come the instrument will be valued at \$50,000.

When the war came on he was operating a workmen's hotel south of the Burlington depot, where he sheltered 27,000 transient men and boys during one year. Then it was "work or fight," and the home was closed.
