'Ace' Hudkins Easy Winner in Bout With Frankie Dean

HE Spanish-American War Veterans fight show has come and gone. It was staged Wednesday night at the Auditorium before a small crowd of spectators.

Three bouts on the program, the main event, semi-windup and third preliminary were out two rounds in length. This was due to the fact that the fighters on these three mills consented to a reduction in wages so that the promoters of the show would not be able to pull it.

No fights featured. They were all far from interesting. The preliminary bouts were about the best and they didn't do anything worthy of note. Many of the spectators got up and made their exit from the Auditorium before the finish of the Herman-Conroy affair which was billed as the main event, but fought as a semi-windup.

"Tiny" Herman entered the ring weighing 119 pounds and looking very much out of condition. His opponent, a Mister Mills Conroy of New York city, entered the arena carrying 192 1/2 pounds. Herman scored a technical knockout over Conroy in the seventh round of a scheduled 10-round bout cut down to eight rounds.

The only surprise about this was that Conroy wasn't counted out before the seventh round.

Conroy hit Herman at least three times, but didn't hurt Tiny. The easterner's greatest trouble was keeping out of the way of Herman's wild swings.

In the last bout of the evening, Ace Hudkins of Nebraska met Frankie Dean of Kansas City. Hudkins easily won the decision at the end of the eight rounds. He hit Dean with everything he had and even took time to aim his rights and lefts.

Frankie Dean, who was the Kansas City boy's hard head, but hit him as often as he did, Hudkins was often step his opponent.

Pierre Nicholas, "Battling" Siki's sparring partner, fighting his first bout in this country, lost a six-round decision to Charlie Long, Omaha cold-fighter.

Long hit the former French soldier with everything he could think of, but as Charlie isn't noted for his hitting his blows didn't do much damage.

The Frenchman showed his game wren throughout the bout. In the last round he rallied and landed out several hard wallops to Long's face and body.

Although defeated, the fans gave the world war veteran a big ovation when he left the ring. For fully five minutes the walls of the auditorium resounded with the cheers and applause of the spectators. Nicholas beat the decision, but the fans liked his gameness.

In the first preliminary "Red" Wilson of Omaha met a tough customer in Ed Petzie of Bassett, Neb. After four rounds of fighting Referee Leo Shea called the bout a draw.

Jack Elberts of Omaha knocked out Kid Elberts of Council Bluffs in the second round of a scheduled four round bout. The Omaha had Elberts on the canvas when the bell sounded for the first round to end.

WISACRES PICK BRACADALE AND MAD PLAY TO MAKE GOOD SHOWING IN BIG RACE SATURDAY

Walsh Sees No Reason for Sudden Support of Sinclair Entry—Believes Black Gold Will Show Hoofs to Classy Field—Past Performances of Western Thoroughbred Good.

EW YORK, May 15.—Eastern "wise money" having shot the trifling matter of \$500,000 on St. James and Sarazen in the winter books, passed along the good word today to back the Sinclair entry in a "play or pay" basis, are satisfied to let the situation ride. They got heavy when Sarazen and St. James, heavily played in the future books were withdrawn from the race last week and Wise Counselor, the hope of Kentucky "went bad." There still seemed to be some hope today that Wise Counselor might be rushed to Churchill Downs for the race but it was a forlorn chance. The Ward colt is hardly up to running a typical mile and a quarter, even if his present form is more creditable than it was at Pinhook.

In any case, Black Gold has taken precedence over Wise Counselor as the western hope in the derby and without reason. He won the Louisiana derby last winter, beating Mad Play in the clinching time of 1:37 2/5 for the mile and two days ago turned 1:37 4/5 spread eagling his field in the derby trial stakes.

As a matter of fact, the writer sees no good reason for the eastern support of Mad Play and Bracadale. Both were badly lumped at the post in the Preskense and Bracadale never got up, finishing 13th. Mad Play came home third but showed nothing.

Drawing a line through Black Gold to the ability of the Sinclair pair, it might be mentioned that Wild Aster, to which Black Gold gave five pounds and a beating in the derby trial, defeated Bracadale at Jamaica last week.
