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AGRICULTURAL CREDIT CORPORATION ALREADY FUNCTIONING TO RELIEVE NORTHWEST. Chicago, May 20.—The \$10,000,000 agricultural credit corporation originally tentatively formed in Chicago at the suggestion of President Coolidge for the relief of the agricultural northwest already has come to the relief of more than 150 banks in North Dakota, South Dakota, Montana, Iowa and Minnesota, it was disclosed today by James R. Howard, a vice president of the organization and president of the National Transportation Institute. The corporation has been in actual operation scarcely more than a month.

In addition to the relief of banks, the credit corporation has established a \$1,000,000 fund for the direct aid of farmers to purchase dairy cows, sheep or brood sows, in order to promote diversified farming in the northwest, Mr. Howard.

The nuclei of a diversified farming territory have been established and it is expected to expand this favored farming movement as rapidly as an experience justifies, to cover the whole territory of the northwestern states. The relief extended to banks to date approximates \$2,000,000, according to the statement. Additional commitments for bank loans which will be turned over as soon as details are worked out amount to \$1,000,000 to \$600,000 more. These sums do not include delinquent tax or interest relief, seed purchases or other direct agricultural appropriations granted or under way, Mr. Howard said.

The credit corporation was organized last February, and its \$10,000,000 fund was subscribed by bankers, manufacturers and business generally.

CANDY MEN TOLD OF MEANEST MAN CLEVELAND, O., May 20.—The storekeeper who swindles children out of their pennies in a game of chance where the child has no chance to win was characterized as the meanest man in the world by George Harvey, New York, addressing the Associated Retail Confectioners of the United States, in convention here.

Mr. Harvey declared the association conference here has started this fraud, the most popular form of which is a large box of chocolates, each piece of which sells for a penny. If it has a pink center the purchaser gets an extra piece free; if it has a chocolate center, he gets a pound; but his changes of doing so are wrecked by the manufacturer inserting a slip telling the dealer which piece is chocolate and advising him to remove them, Mr. Harvey said.
