### U. S. Rubber, Once Up to 143, Sells Yesterday at 22

**Stock Under Heavy Pressure for Months—New York Market Generally Strong Otherwise.**

New York, May 21.—United States Rubber, which in 1920 sold as high as 125, now sells at 22 1/2.

The stock was under heavy pressure for months. The southern condition of the rubber industry and the decline in the price of raw rubber in the last year have combined to upset the calculations of manufacturers and investors.

Despite the extreme weakness of United States Rubber, the stock market was generally strong today. Gloom consequent to the passage of the bonus measure was dispelled and there was a sharp recovery from the decline of the day before.

In the uptown prices, there were fairly large transactions in U. S. Steel, Philadelphia and Reading Coal and Iron, Standard Oil of New Jersey, Southern Pacific, Colorado Fuel and Iron and American Telephone and Telegraph.

Transactions were not large, aggregating about \$100,000,000.

A definite improvement in the steel industry is indicated in the weekly report of the American Iron and Steel Institute.

Weather reports were uniformly unfavorable. Sugar was slightly higher.

Corn and wheat were higher.

Other commodities were steady.

Markets were generally strong.

Investment opportunities were noted.

Market activity was high.

Financial news was favorable.
