Traffic Signal Bells to Ring 'Stop' and 'Go'; Signs Will Say It, Too

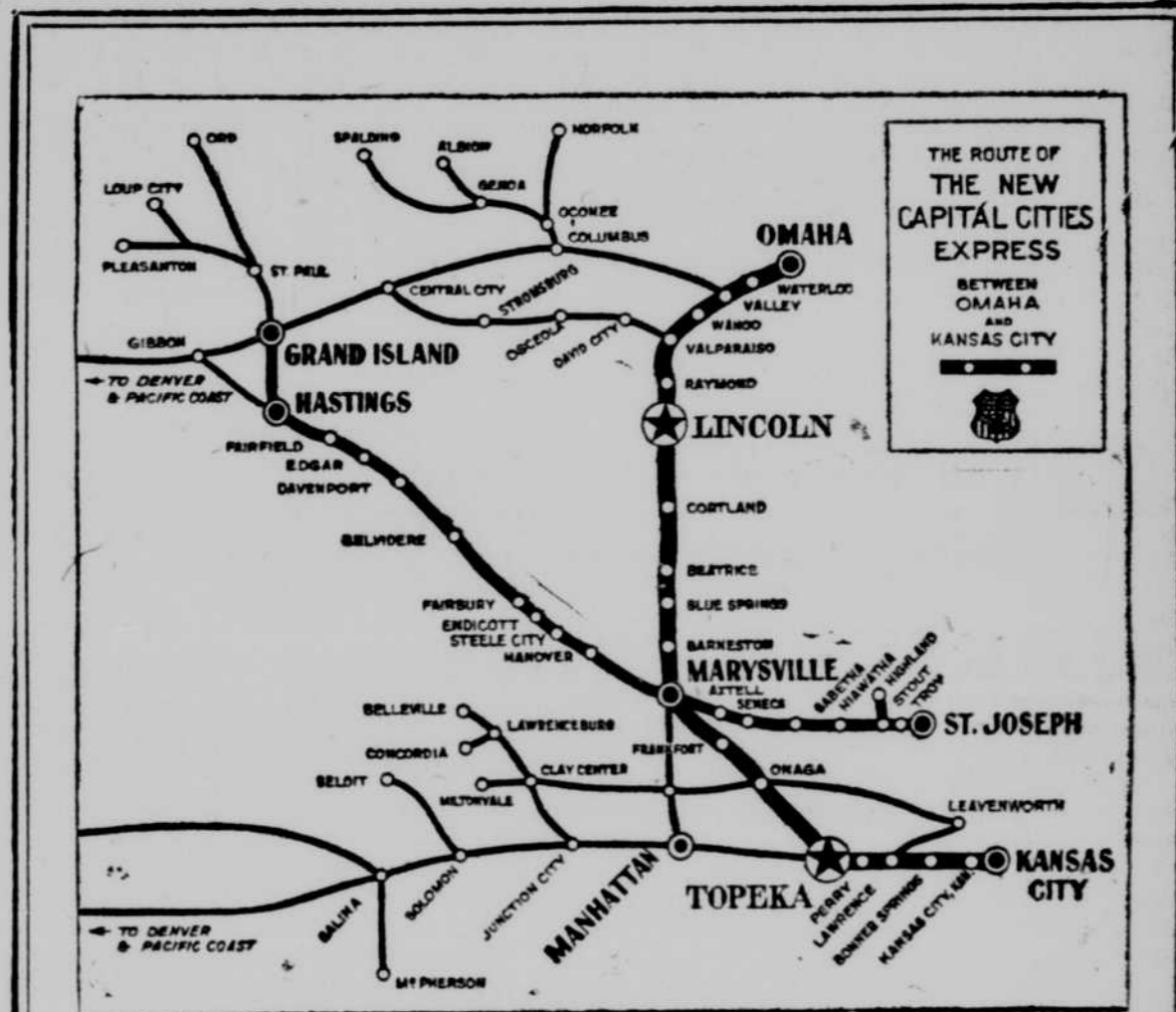
Changes in the traffic signals at Sixteenth and Farnam streets and at Sixteenth and Harney streets have been made by the Yellow Cab company, which installed the signals.
