A Prophecy That Failed But It Showed the Growth of Omaha and the Growth of Omaha Real Estate

When the commissioners of Douglas county decided in the early 80s, to erect a new courthouse for Omaha, they planned one that "would meet the needs of 100 years."


In later years, during periods of depression over the entire country, Mr. Rush, with thousands of others, lost all his investments, EXCEPT HIS REAL ESTATE.
