New York, May 31.—The Yankees' champions divided another doubleheader with the Athletics today, winning the first game but losing the second.

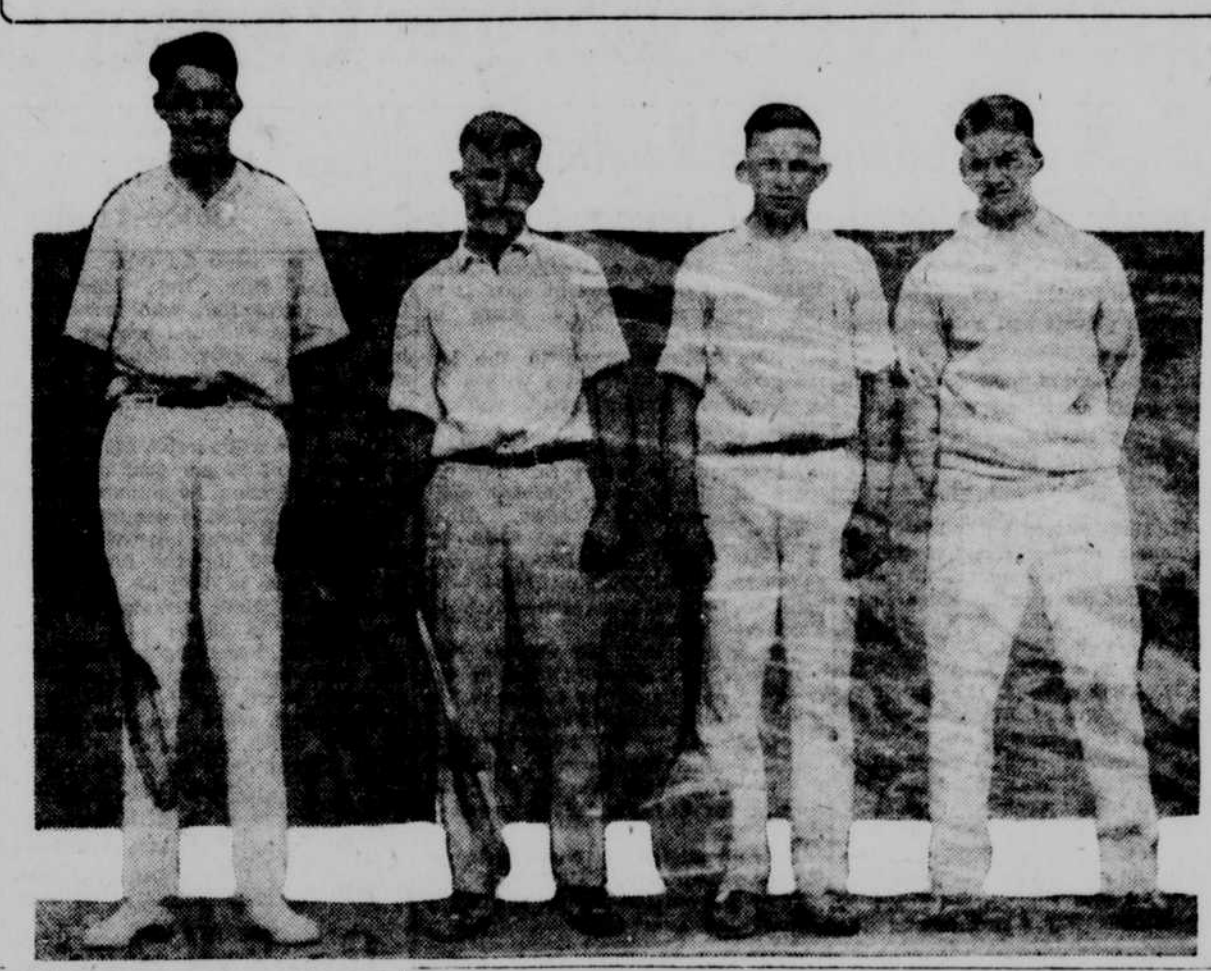
Tigers Defeat Indians
