

C. B. Irwin's "All Over" Wins Derby at Ak-Sar-Ben Track Saturday

Outsiders Upset Dope by Winning Trio of Events

Randall's Royal Comes Home Winner in First Race at Big Odds — The Desert Wins Last Affair.

All Over, carrying the colors of the C. B. Irwin stable, won the King's Derby at the Ak-Sar-Ben track Saturday afternoon. Second thoughts, pride of the Jones-Udlike string, ran a game race and finished in second place. Chiva, another Irwin entry, finished third.

At the start second thoughts jumped into the lead position and held it after being challenged by Chiva until passing the far turn. She caught Chiva a furlong farther on and again took the lead.

All Over came up from the rear and, hugging the rail, carried on from there and won by five lengths, pulled up.

The mudders came into their own Saturday at the Ak-Sar-Ben track when the starter blew his whistle for the first event of the day. The heavy rain of Friday night had turned the track into a veritable sea of mud.

Look at This Price! Randall's Royal, forgotten by the fans that passed early through the turnstiles, showed his speed in this first race and led the field down the stretch easily.

Rungeorge, valiant-hearted son of Runymede, did his best and tried to be a contender in the stretch, but was forced to be satisfied with place. St. Angelina, running in as good form in the slop as she has on fast tracks, successfully held onto her show position.

The second race went to Miss Emma G. That handsome mare outpaced her contenders from the post. Ask Jesse challenged her early and hung on until the turn for home was made, only to be and give way.

Ask Jesse was fortunate in saving second position at the finish. Blue Van, long shot of Thursday, showed a taste for mud and romped into show money. Jack Led, unknown, lost his race at the start.

Condon Family Takes to Water Like Ducks



THE family of three girls and two boys of Dr. and Mrs. A. P. Condon of the Nicholas-Senn hospital of this city are fast becoming well known throughout this country as great swimmers. Under the expert instruction of Coach Pete Wendell, two of the Condon sisters, Helen and Corinne, are holders of Mid-western championships.

All are master life savers. Shelley just finishing his life saving tests. He is 9 years old. Helen, Lillian, Corinne and Albert also hold master swimmer's degrees.

Helen won the National A. A. U. 50-yard free-style championship last year and has held all Mid-western A. A. U. records for free style, breast stroke, backstroke and fancy diving up to this year.

Corinne, 13 years old, is the wonder swimmer of Nebraska. On May 10 she won the Mid-western A. A. U. 50-yard free style championship in 23 seconds equalling the world's record held by Helen Watwright of New York.

She also lowered her sister Helen's record for the 50-yard backstroke when she won this event in 38.45 seconds.

Helen Condon still holds all long distance, free style, backstroke, and breaststroke records for the Mid-western A. A. U., covering the territory of Nebraska, Iowa, North and South Dakota.

Lillian is an expert master swimmer and although she has not gone in for competition, she swims in fast form.

Chicago, June 7.—Illinois won the conference outdoor track championship at Stagg field here today in the twenty-fourth annual conference meet. Coach Harry Gillis' crack Illinois athletes placed in 13 of the 16 events and scored 74 points, the largest total ever made in the history of the games.

Despite the cold weather and a stiff north wind that hindered the runners on the back stretch, Charley Brookings of Iowa managed to clip a tenth of a second off his world's record on the 220-yard low hurdles around a turn. His time was 23.45 seconds.

"Bud" Evans of Illinois tied the conference 220-yard record around a turn, set at 23.5 seconds by Archie Babin of Michigan in 1903.
