

Mystery Company Submits Low Bid for City Paving

"George Parks" Firm Underbids on Asphaltic Concrete by 30 Cents a Yard.

The George Parks Construction company is the style of a new paving concern which surprised the city council Tuesday morning with low bids of asphaltic concrete and brick. These bids on asphaltic concrete ranged from \$2.23 to \$2.55 and on brick from \$2.39 to \$3.53. The Parks bids on asphaltic concrete are 30 cents per yard lower than the Flinn bids of \$2.53 last February, which caused a sensation in the city hall. The question arises: "Why and what is the George Parks Construction company?"

George Parks is known here as a contractor. During the last several years he has been identified with the National Construction company with which the Wickhams of Council Bluffs are interested.

Leo Wickham in the council chamber Tuesday morning stated that Parks had not been on Tuesday, the National company's office for several days, in fact since last Thursday. In any event, asphaltic concrete paving hit the low level of \$2.23 a yard and various paving contractors rubbed their eyes in amazement when these last bids were opened by the city council.

BANK OFFICER ON TRIAL AT DENISON

Denison, Ia., June 10.—A trial has been in progress for the last week to determine whether the officers of the Valley bank at West Side, which closed its doors April 5, 1923, were guilty of receiving money while knowing the bank was insolvent. All the officers were indicted and the case against E. B. Spottedwood is being tried.

The state is represented by E. G. Graham of Jefferson and J. E. Shawvan of Jefferson and the defense is being conducted by Leon Powers of Denison. There are 10 men and two women on the jury. The state presented the bank books and endeavored to show that the bank officers must have known the business was insolvent. The defendant is particularly charged with issuing a certificate of deposit to D. E. Benson of West Side not many days before the closing of the bank.

DENTISTS REQUIRE CITIZEN PAPERS

New rulings for securing a dentist's license in Nebraska were made by the state medical examining board in their meeting here Tuesday. The applicant must now be a graduate of a recognized American dental college and must have his first citizenship papers.

Any foreign applicant must enter the junior year of an American graduate to get his license, although credited dental college and then he may have been a graduate from a college in any foreign country.

The polls at the chamber suite will close at 6 Wednesday evening. When the votes are counted 87 directors will have been selected for the ensuing year.

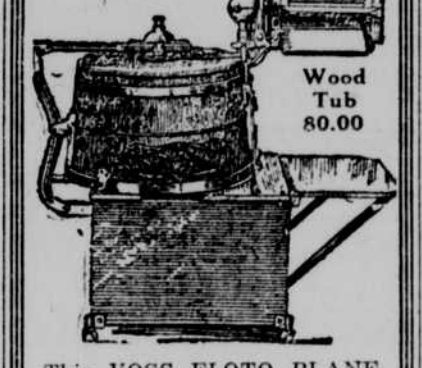
