

### Mondell Urges Insurgent Ban; Meets Applause

#### Points Out That Republicans Have Not Had Working Majority in Congress During Last Session.

this recognition and applauded generously the committee's decision, which the convention cordially ratified. Each state hereafter will have one man and one woman on the committee. The democrats gave this recognition to the women voters long ago.

Mrs. Elizabeth Martin of Pennsylvania, first woman to be chairman of a committee in a republican convention, was enthusiastically applauded when introduced to present the report on permanent organization. This report designated Mondell as permanent chairman, Mondell having been chosen by President Coolidge when Mondell was in Washington two weeks ago.

Temporary Chairman Burton was glad to turn the gavel over to Mondell, as his voice was nearly done. Mondell put the remainder of the program through smoothly, his long experience in the house was a leader of the "regulars" standing him in good stead. When he called for the report of the platform committee, he was advised it was not ready, so when Charles Dewey Hilles of New York, moved a recess until 8, Mondell took the program firmly in his teeth and declared the motion carried after a response of a few feeble "ayes" and a chorus of "noes" that shook the auditorium.

**Text of Speech.**  
Text of Mr. Mondell's speech follows:  
"Ladies and gentlemen of the convention:  
"We are met as the representatives of a great political party that has never failed nor faltered in its service or loyalty to the republic; that has never proposed nor advocated an unwise or unsound policy, and it is our privilege on behalf of this party to place in nomination for the highest office in the gift of the American people candidates who shall measure up to the finest standards of party leadership and who shall be entitled to, and, we confidently believe will receive the support of a large majority of the American voters at the polls in November.  
"We meet profoundly appreciative of wise, patriotic and inspiring party leadership in the past and earnestly thankful that the kindly providence and the great good fortune which gave our party and the nation Lincoln, McKinley, Roosevelt and Harding has vouchsafed for us as the worthy successor of those distinguished patriots the confidence-inspiring character of Calvin Coolidge.  
**Endorsement Justified.**  
"The American people placed the stamp of their approval on the candidates of the last republican national convention by a majority of more than 5,500,000. Time and events have abundantly justified that unparalleled endorsement. He who was chosen as the party standard bearer proved his statesmanship in the skillful handling and wise adjustment of important and weighty domestic and international questions and problems. Diligent in the nation's business, courageous in action, he gave himself in public counsel, honest and self-unreservedly, mind and body, heart and soul, to the nation, and became as truly a martyr to patriotic service as any soldier stricken on the field of battle.  
"How well he fitted and became the great office to which he was chosen. History will write his name high on the roll of able and efficient executives, but we who knew and loved him best will cherish most the recollection of his great and kindly heart, his tender and sympathetic soul. The nation mourned him as one mourns a brother beloved and entrusted him in the only enduring hall of fame—the loyal hearts of a grateful people.  
"Confidence was the keynote of the sentiment which inspired the nomination of Calvin Coolidge at Chicago four years ago. That confi-

dence grew as he modestly performed the duties of the position to which he was elected, and strengthened prodigiously as he met and handled in thoughtful, sympathetic and courageous fashion the many difficult and trying problems presented to him in the presidential office.  
"Confidence in President Coolidge is the most important and outstanding fact in the political situation today, and in the presence of inevitable differences of opinion on questions of moment, this confidence is a fine compliment to the American people as it is to the president; a spontaneous sincere faith, high courage and honest and unselfish purpose.  
"Never was an administration confronted with more difficult and perplexing problems than those presented to the republican administration and congress elected four years ago, and the marvelous record of legislative and administrative accomplishment which followed is without parallel in the annals of government.  
**Spending Orgy Checked.**  
"The orgy of reckless and extravagant expenditure, which had been checked by the preceding republican congress, was succeeded by an economical and business-like conduct of public affairs under a budget system wisely drawn and faithfully adhered to. The burden of war taxation was greatly reduced. The public debt was steadily diminished. The armies of the unemployed, more numerous than the hosts that the nation marshaled in the world war, were soon absorbed in the ranks of industry, as wise legislation and sound administration relieved the nation and its people from the handicap of democratic policies.  
"Never before in our history has the need and necessity of dependable party majorities and definite party responsibility been so clearly demonstrated as in the very recent past. Legislative control by shifting and changing combinations, resulting in majorities having no common faith and recognizing no united responsibility, can not, in the nature of

things, produce legislative results beneficial or satisfactory to the people of the country. The inevitable effect of such legislative control is confusion and paralysis and a legislative product satisfactory to no one.  
"Every serious fault of recent legislation and every failure to complete and round out a satisfactory legislative program would and could have been avoided had there been dependable republican majorities in the congress. The one certain and assured remedy for such a condition is the election of a congress, republican, by a goodly majority, both in name and principle.  
**Open Season for Claims**  
"This is the open season for wild claim and wild assertion on the part of our friends, the political enemy. Only recently emerged from beneath the political landslide of four years ago they attempt to appear as confident as they were just before being engulfed in that overwhelming catastrophe.  
"In the moments they can spare from their fierce family feuds and rivalries they make a pretense of assuming to believe that they successfully laid down a smoke screen through which their transparent partisan purposes shall not be discovered, and in the contemplation of which all of their sins of omission and commission, of discredited policies and discreditable administration shall be overlooked, and forgotten.  
"If the American people were prepared to forget—as the democrats themselves endeavor to do—the wholly indefensible record of the democratic party in earlier days, they certainly could not overlook the fact that the most recent record of that party is one devoid of a single redeeming feature; of scandalous mismanagement, of unwise and indefensible policy, when in control and utter lack of fixed and definite principle or policy, save that of muckraking and obstruction, when in minority.  
**Faith Justified.**  
"As we proceed to the nomination of our candidates and the drafting

of our platform we may find inspiration in the fact that ours is the only national party in America that can and does point with pride to each and every candidate nominated at its conventions and to every declaration made in any of its platforms. All human experience justifies faith and confidence in an organization with such a history. The record of wise leadership, sound policy, and faithful public service in the past affords the best possible guaranty of the future.

"A tree is known by its fruit; not by the showy flowers of promise or the occasional defect in bud or branch, but by the normal harvest through the running of the years—and the harvest of the republican party and leadership is faithfully reflected in the matchless growth and fadeless glory of the republic."

### Nebraska U Is on Army Honor Roll

#### State University Military Work Is Commended by War Department.

The University of Nebraska has been designated as one of the honor schools in the Seventh Corps area, according to a telegram received by Maj. Gen. George B. Duncan from the War Department.  
Other schools in the area to obtain this distinction are the Universities of Missouri and North Dakota Agriculture college.  
The schools are graded following inspections by army officers. Three University of Nebraska men picked by the faculty will receive appointments of second lieutenant in the regular army.  
The War Department through General Duncan expressed appreciation of the support given by the Nebraska and the other universities.

### MEDICAL STUDENTS COMPLETE EXAMS

One hundred twenty students of the University of Nebraska college of medicine finished their examinations for certificates from the state board Wednesday noon at the college.  
The examinations have been held since Monday. Dr. J. D. Case of Lincoln and Dr. E. T. McGuire of Mead, Neb., who were in charge the final day, reported that the majority of students have passed the examinations this year with high percentage. J. A. Spatz of Fairfield, Neb., and Dr. H. J. Lehnhoff of Lincoln are the other members of the state board.

for Gen. Frank T. Hines; Minnesota, no candidate named.  
It was this situation that prompted the motion to appoint a special committee to go back to the state delegations and see what could be done over night about getting them into agreement on one name or a small group of names. Chairman McNider pointed out that a short list of three or four men acceptable to the western group would be considered by "those in control" of the convention.  
"Never Get Together."  
C. H. McKenzie of the Minnesota delegation remarked that "the trouble with the west is that we never get together on anything," while Governor Groesbeck of Michigan warned the meeting it must face the difficulty that many of the state delegations were pledged or instructed and not free to act. Appointment of the committee with McNider as chairman and Representative Fincher of Kansas as secretary, followed, last speakers urging speed as the convention would nominate tomorrow.  
The committee met at once and a proposal that it express itself for the names of Governor Hyde, Senators Phipps and Curtis and Representative Dickinson for vice president, was quashed without debate.  
It was agreed to work among the delegations during the night session of the convention and reconvene immediately afterward.
